Hogan Breaks Record In Winning Texas Tourney

San Antonio, Tex., Feb. 11 — (U.P.) — Ben Hogan, the little man with the big swing, headed for New Orleans today with a new Texas open record, first prize money of \$1,500 and a set of very hot golf clubs in his possession.

Hogan, the former Texas Caddy, was one of the favorites to win the \$7,500 New Orleans open which starts Thursday.

Byrd Trails
It was Hogan's day yesterday and even though the defending champion, Sammy Byrd, matched him stroke for stroke, he couldn't reduce the margin between them and finished six strokes behind.

Hogan's 72-hole total of 264 broke the old Texas open record by four strokes. His final round of 64, which was seven under par, was within one stroke of tying the 18-hole Brackenridge course record of 63.

In the coast conference northern division, Oregon State and Idaho were deadlocked for the leadership after the Vandals' 35 to 33 victory over Washington State Saturday night. Each has seven victories and four defeats. Guard Jack Catbaugh dumped in the winning basket in the final few seconds of play.

Other week-end basketball games saw University of Montana run roughshod over Gonzaga university twice, finishing up Saturday night with the count 102 to 49 in their favor.

Honolulu Granted Conditional Grid Franchise in West Coast Pro Loop

San Francisco, Feb. 11 — (U.P.) — Salt Lake City and Honolulu were granted 1946 franchises in the Pacific Coast Professional football league today — the latter on a conditional basis that it play only in the islands.

Honolulu representatives Ray Winterbottom and Leo Engler hoped to communicate today with the club's backer, Francis J. Brickner, wealthy Honolulu sportsman, to determine whether he would accept the league's terms.

The league asked that Honolulu confine its play to the islands, with other league members visiting there, presumably

because west coast stadia already are swamped with date requests.

If Honolulu accepts, the league will start the 1946 season with nine — and possibly 10 — teams. Besides Honolulu and Salt Lake City, it would include Seattle, Portland, Oakland, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Hollywood, San Diego and — probably — Sacramento.

J. Rufus Klawans was re-elected president of the league at the close of the season. Al Davies, owner of the Seattle club, was elected vice president, and J. Howard Sullivan, vice president of the Los Angeles Bulldogs, was chosen secretary.

Hoop Tournament Plans Ready For Class "B" Event

Southern Oregon College, Ashland, February 9 — Plans for the Southern Oregon College Invitational basketball tournament scheduled for the Southern Oregon College gymnasium on March 6-7-8-9 are moving ahead rapidly with only four weeks remaining before game-time, according to R. W. McNeal, tournament director.

First games will be called for the afternoon of Wednesday, March 6, with every team entered scheduled to play. The tournament will be so arranged that a team must lose two games before being eliminated.

Trophies this year will be awarded to winners of first, second, third, fourth and fifth places.

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polled one week before the annual "bowling bonanza" ended last night.

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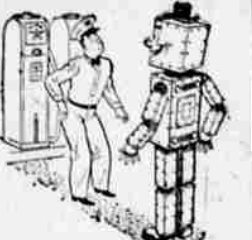
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
