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BOLDEN TOOK DIVE IN BOUT WITH FOX, OFFICIAL CHARGES

Philadelphia, Feb. 12—(U.P.)—Brown-skinned Billy Fox was offering a guarantee of \$50,000 today to Champion Gus Lesnevich for a light-heavyweight title fight in April, while Billy's 37th consecutive knockout victim, veteran Nate Bolden of Chicago, awaited a hearing Friday to determine if he had "quit cold" in the second round last night.

Bolden's purse of \$1,750 was help up pending the hearing on his knockout which occurred at 49 seconds of the second round before a near-capacity crowd of 8,177 at the Philadelphia arena. The gate was \$23,188.82.

Hearing Promised
Leon L. Rains, chairman of the Pennsylvania state athletic commission, declared angrily today: "Bolden will have a fair hearing; but it is my opinion that he quit cold and that he probably won't be paid a penny."

Rains witnessed the abbreviated bout from a ringside seat. He saw Referee Irving Kutcher count out the 27-year-old Negro after he had fallen to the canvas, face down. Rains claimed he did not see the punch that floored Bolden for the fourth.

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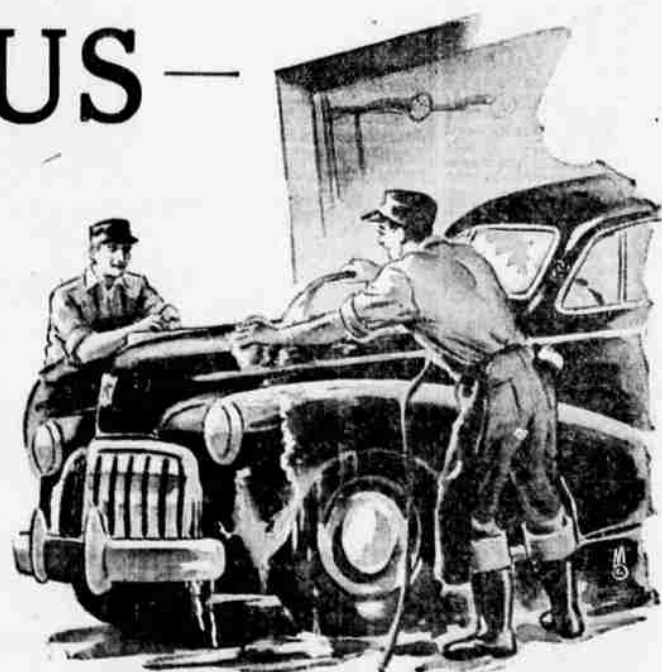
