They include forwards Bob Hallisey, ex-Holy Cross, and Ted Hanauer, ex-Indiana, and guards Eddie Fessler, ex-Marquette, and Ralph Miller, ex-Toledo. Center Bob Karstens from Davenport, Ia., is a former semi-pro star. He coaches the club and his specialty while playing is a juggling act said to be well worth the price of admission. George Anderson, Benton Harbor, Mich., is manager and guard. Rugged guard, Ed Hansen, playing his first season with the Davids, rounds out the squad.

Play 125 Games
Contesting in approximately 125 games, the team's itinerary covers nearly 20,000 miles a year. It is the only basketball quint competing with authorization of the Israelite or House of David Colony.

Manager Anderson, stellar performer on the David baseball nine, which he also handles, will take the diamond aggregation on the road next spring for its first jaunt since Pearl Harbor.

San Francisco, Feb. 14 — (U.P.) — Sleepy Jim Crowley, commissioner of the All-American pro football conference, declared today that any peace overtures in the nationwide pigskin feud would have to come from the National League owners.

"Over a year ago we offered to go about building a rival league on a business-like basis—

OPA MAN SPEAKS AT KIWANIS MEET

Emphasizing the harm that could come to the mainly agricultural northwest if price control is lifted from only manufactured goods, L. J. Bronaugh, representative from the district OPA office in Portland, told Kiwanians yesterday noon that more consideration should be given the people's bloc and that small interest blocs, in which "there is no merit," should not prevail.

Bronaugh stated that "the people of our nation have a \$300 billion buying power but that expenditures must be made judiciously if prosperity is to last."

URGE OSTRACISM FOR ARGENTINA

Washington, Feb. 14 — (U.P.) — Congressional demands for the United States to sever relations with Argentina piled up today in the wake of the state department's "blue book" blast against the Argentine military regime. Sen. Joseph F. Guffey, D., Pa., said the Nazi-like policies of Argentina were a grave threat to democracy. He urged President Truman and the state department to proclaim the Argentine government "an enemy of peace, security and freedom."

He proposed that the United States also instruct its delegates to the United Nations assembly in London to seek Argentina's suspension before the current session ends.

Rep. Emily Taft Douglas, D., Ill., said that "with every major enemy defeated, it would be absurd for us after all the tragedy of World War II to let its spawn flourish in the Americas."

ACTOR DIES
Hollywood, Feb. 14 — (U.P.) — Harold S. Bucquet, 54, British-born movie director who started as a Hollywood extra, died last week at his home here.

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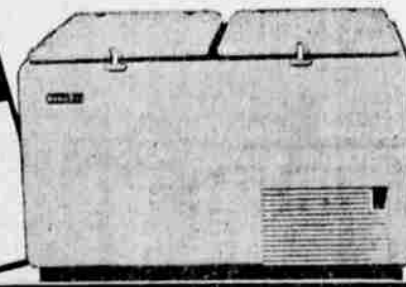
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
