

HULL DECLARES SHORTAGES DUE TO GOVERNMENT

Portland, Ore., Feb. 14—(U.P.) Frank Hull of Medford, Ore., president of the Oregon chamber executives, today blamed government regulation for "today's confusion in this country."

Here to direct the two-day convention of his organization, which opened today, Hull summed up the housing shortage by saying, "let the men who know how build houses. Turn them loose with the materials and they'll do it."

"Had the government allowed private enterprise to go ahead without stranglehold restrictions, we'd have been out of this mess and we'd today be buying electric stoves, refrigerators, oil burners—and, yes, automobiles."

After a tour of the state he reported service men in every community who, with their wives, had been forced to live in homes with their parents.

KLAMATH MARINE BARRACKS MAY BE GIVEN STATE

Salem, Feb. 14 — Possibility that the marine barracks at Klamath Falls, together with all of its facilities, may be turned over to the state of Oregon, free of charge, for utilization by the state board of higher education in coping with the increasing educational demands of returning service men and women, was announced by Governor Earl Snell here Wednesday.

Inspection of the barracks recently was made by Dr. A. L. Strand, Oregon State college; Dean Earl Pallett, representing Dr. Harry Newburn, University of Oregon; Dr. Charles Byrne, secretary of the state board of higher education, and Dr. John Cramer, dean of general education. They were accompanied by State Budget Director Aiken, who represented Governor Snell.

The Klamath Falls institution, Governor Snell said, is one of the most elaborate of its kind in the country and represents an expenditure of between \$6,000,000 and \$7,000,000.

Sixty-five major structures are included along with the largest dining room ever built by the navy. There also is an auditorium with a seating capacity of 1100, gymnasium, modern theater, huge swimming pool, class rooms, vocational training setups, hospital and infirmary and other facilities.

Governor Snell said the board of higher education probably would be faced with certain problems and details of administration and finance, but these could be worked out.

The order providing for closing the Klamath marine institution already has been issued, effective March 1.

Roosevelt Heirs Seek Exemption From Income Tax

Albany, N. Y., Feb. 14—(U.P.)—Heirs of the late Franklin D. Roosevelt have appealed to the New York state tax commission to rule that the president died a soldier, it was learned reliably today.

Through Basil O'Connor, law partner of the late president, the estate contends that the president's role as commander-in-chief of the armed forces entitles the heirs to a substantial state and federal income tax exemption.

The exemption would amount to thousands of dollars on the late president's income from his family holdings and his salary as president.

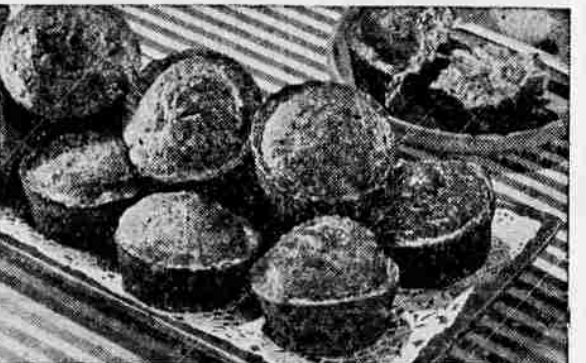
