

PLACER MINING CONTROL DATES FIXED BY BOARD

In a recent session of the Rogue River Coordination board, a resolution was passed governing placer mining along the Rogue and its tributaries between April 15 and November 1.

Signed by Jack Dunphy, chairman, and Board Members T. V. Scott and J. E. Bartlett, the resolution orders "No person, firm, or corporation shall, between (dates given) operate or assist in the operation of any mine or mining operation whereby water containing mud or tailings is discharged into the Rogue river or any river, creek, or stream emptying into said Rogue river, when the turbidity of said river, creek, or stream at the point of confluence with said Rogue river is in excess of 1,000 ppm by weight of suspended matter."

The resolution in dealing with the Illinois river and the Applegate river, both tributaries of the Rogue, forbids discharge of water from placer mining when the turbidity of said rivers at a point where the bridges on the Redwood highway cross such streams is in excess of 1,000 ppm by weight of suspended matter.

In the prosecution of violation of this order, the board directs that it shall not be necessary to prove service of notice upon the defendant.

Productivity Best Inflation Control Says Henry Ford

Los Angeles, Feb. 14—(AP)—The public is a better watchdog against high prices than the OPA, today said Henry Ford II following his arrival for a study of Ford company operations here.

"Price ceilings should be knocked off, at least in the automobile industry, because competition would take care of

prices," declared the 28-year-old president of the Ford organization. "Productivity is the only way to stop inflation."

He said his organization is held back only by lack of material in its plans to turn out as many as 750,000 cars this year.

Ford indicated that the Long Beach assembly plant, only Ford plant in the country producing automobiles, may be forced to

shut down at the end of this week because of lack of material.

TEA ARRIVES

pounds—was unloaded today from the American Mail Lines' freighter Gilbert Stuart. The tea had been consigned from Colombo, Ceylon. The Gilbert Stuart also carried a consignment of crude rubber.

Two Distinctive Meals with Low-Cost Meats

Many of my most appealing menus are planned around inexpensive cuts of meat. Here are two of my best-like dinners that are sure to bring you compliments from guests or family.

OLD-FASHIONED BOILED DINNER
Don't forget this old favorite for a wintry day. Even the most discriminating eaters go for it. I like to serve it with hot corn bread or cornmeal muffins and a frosted apple dumpling for dessert. I always pass some of the "pot liquor" and a bowl of mustard-radish sauce.

To serve 6, simmer 4 or 5 pounds of boiling beef (choose short ribs, brisket, plate or chuck for this) in a large kettle for 3 or 4 hours or until tender. About 1/2 hour before serving time place on top of the meat 6 medium-sized peeled potatoes, carrots, white turnips, onions, cabbage wedges and parsnips. Sprinkle lightly with salt and cover tightly. Simmer until vegetables are done. Arrange attractively on a large platter around the meat, keeping all of one kind of vegetable together.

POT ROAST WITH RICH VEGETABLE GRAVY
Here's gravy that's really something. For a Sunday dinner I like to serve pot roast and gravy and accompany it with fluffy mashed potatoes, broccoli with lemon butter, grapefruit and avocado salad with French dressing, whole wheat biscuits and lemon chiffon pie.
