BIBLE EDUCATION BOARD MEETING SET FOR TUESDAY

The annual meeting of the Medford board of Christian Education will be held at the YMCA here Tuesday at 7:30 p. m., according to Dr. Louis Kirby, president of the group. The organization is engaged in Bible teaching in the public schools. Major business of the meeting will be election of officers for the ensuing year, committee reports and consideration of the teaching staff.

During this school year 21 churches and affiliated organizations have sponsored Bible teaching in the four elementary schools in Medford, at the Howard school, and also in the fourth, fifth and sixth grades of the Central Point system. In the Medford system, activity periods have been opened in the fourth, fifth and sixth with 490 pupils enrolled. At the Howard school, all but two or three children are in the classes. All but the first and second grades are in the set-up there. Ninety-nine per cent are enrolled in Central Point grade school.

Mrs. Kathryn Brougner, formerly of Seattle, has been the teacher this year.

Each affiliated group is urged to have two official delegates on hand for the meeting Tuesday night.

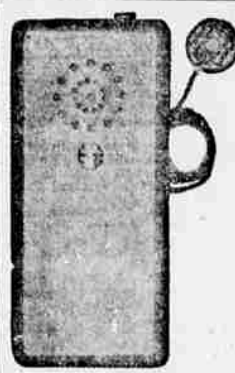
