Speaking on how the war has affected the educational standards of women, Dr. Elmo Stevenson, new president of the Southern Oregon college, addressed members of the Medford Branch, American Association of University Women, at the February meeting held at the home of Mrs. Justin Smith, 21 Geneva street, Wednesday night.

Dr. Stevenson made a point of the fact that women are now accepted in various professions

where they were never accepted before the war and said that colleges are now bringing into their curricula courses that meet the needs of all women, whether it be home-making or engineering. Many women are now taking courses in engineering and are very successful in this type of work, the educator said.

Dr. Stevenson also stated that large numbers of returned servicemen and women are availing themselves of the opportunity offered by the government to attend colleges all over the country. These, on the whole, are making splendid students, he said, probably due to the fact that they now know what they want from education and fully appreciate the opportunity to pursue a higher education.
