

SUSAN VILAS ON MAGAZINE COVER FOR NEXT MONTH

A Kodachrome photograph of Miss Susan Vilas, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Vilas, 1018 South Oakdale avenue, is pictured on the cover of the March issue of Coronet magazine, now on city news stands. The picture was made by Mead-Maddick, Hollywood professional photographer, in December and was selected from 33 poses submitted by the photographer to Coronet's editors.

Miss Vilas, a blue-eyed blonde, is shown in an informal pose. The picture is credited to "Susan Vance" on the table-of-contents page, this being an assumed professional name. The Medford girl came to the attention of Hollywood photographers and studio officials while in the south to visit friends several months ago. She subsequently took up the study of dramatics, posed for photographs made by Paul Hesse as well as Mead-Maddick and was offered an opportunity to work under the direction of Howard Hawks, independent Hollywood movie producer, who considered Miss Vilas extremely photogenic.

After returning to Medford for a stay with her family, Miss Vilas decided against accepting the contract offer. 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TAMBORINI TOPS ARGENTINA VOTE

Buenos Aires, Feb. 23.—(U.P.)—Argentina's long-awaited presidential election comes off tomorrow and a nationwide poll of newspaper correspondents forecast today that Democratic Candidate Dr. Jose Tamborini could win all but three of the country's 14 provinces and the capital federal district, which would give him a large majority of the electoral college vote.

P-TA HEADS MEET WITH HEDRICK TO TALK REMODELING

Representatives of the city's various Parent-Teacher associations met with E. H. Hedrick, superintendent of schools, Friday afternoon to discuss the proposed plan to remodel, repair and build additions for the city's schools. The group met at the invitation of the superintendent and each group of representatives brought suggestions for their school.

Major suggestion made by the parents was that a disinterested, competent and recognized authority on school planning and school construction be employed by the school board to make a survey of the entire public school system in Medford. Purpose of the survey would be to assist in determining the best use to be made of existing facilities and the best program for the remodeling and enlarging of present school buildings as well as the construction of new units or additions, it was said.

It was pointed out that the survey should take into consideration all of the factors which concern the benefit and welfare of pupils and teachers. The superintendent stated that in all probability the survey would be authorized by the board. Representatives of the P.T.A. groups state that the associations wish to cooperate fully with the school board and with the school superintendent in planning a long-range program adequate to meet the present and future needs of the community and the superintendent has indicated that he welcomes the interest and suggestions of the parents.

extends beyond legal covenants, beyond promises, beyond independence."

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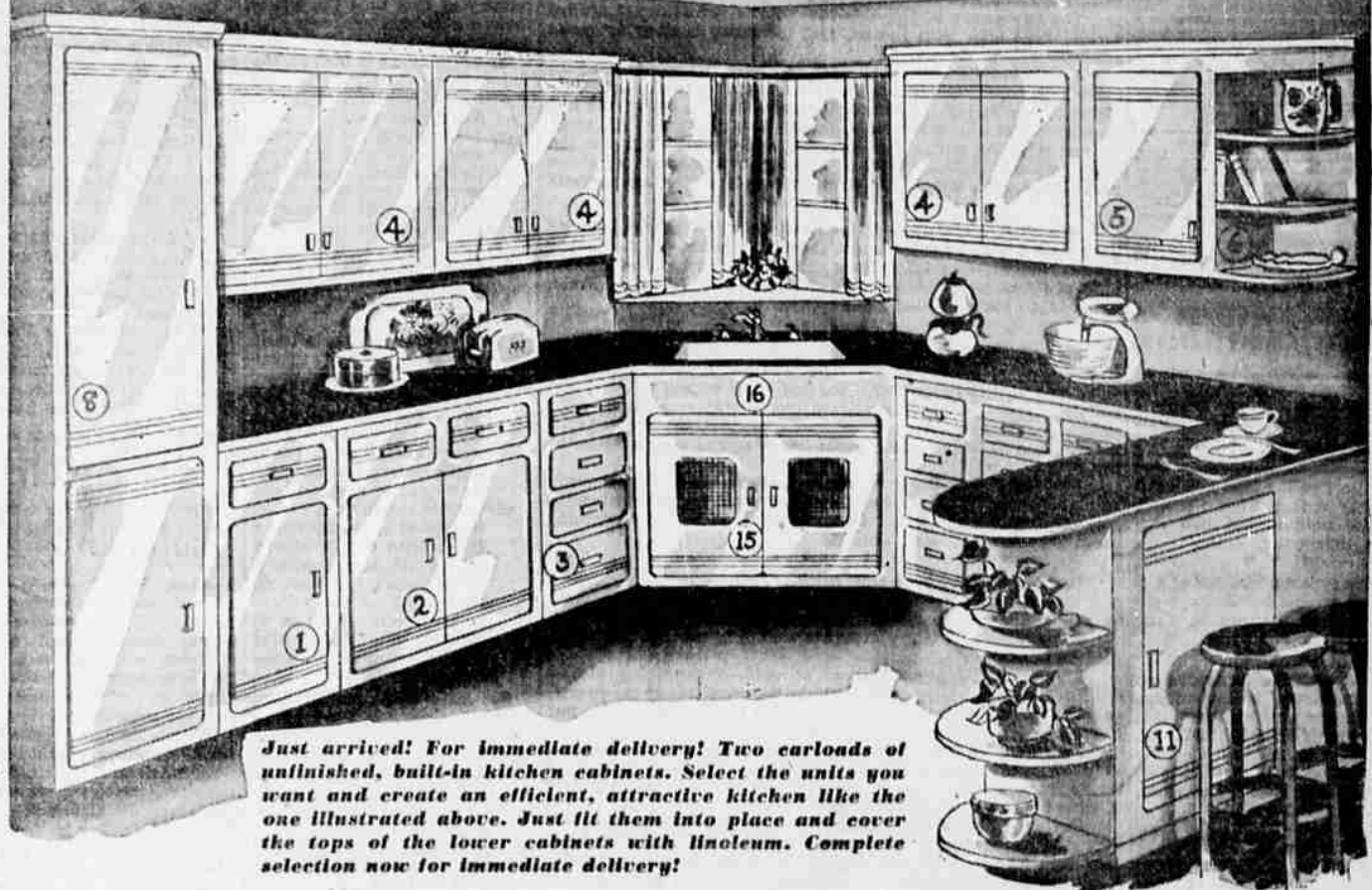
