

SGT. HIRT LINKED TO HITLER'S SPY CLIQUE BY SWISS

Hamilton Field, Cal., Feb. 25.—U.P.—The government established its first direct link today between S/Sgt. Frank Hirt, army air force mechanic, and the world-wide network of Nazi spies with whom he is accused of conspiring to trade U. S. military secrets for German cash.

Moritz Buser, confessed Swiss member of the Hitler spy ring already serving a prison term, said in a deposition introduced in Hirt's court martial that he knew the 31-year-old defendant and had given him \$4000 to be used for espionage purposes in the United States.

It was the first deposition in

which an already convicted spy has pointed directly to the American-born sergeant who was arrested last March at Fairfield-Suisun airbase, on charges he sought to transmit vital information on aircraft and inventions to German agents in Brazil, Spain, Switzerland and eventually Germany.

A former first lieutenant in the Swiss army, Buser said he received word from Germany in 1941 to expect a German operative named "Willie." In November of that year, he said, he received a phone call from a man who identified himself as "Willie," and when "Willie" arrived in person it was Frank Hirt.

In the deposition, he described how he picked Hirt's photograph out of a series of pictures for both Swiss police and later American counter-intelligence officers.

The 11-man court martial panel adjourned for the weekend shortly after introduction of Buser's deposition.
