Pointers vs. Gold Hill, Rogues to Battle Jacksonville in Class "B" County Hoop Playoff Here Tonight

Central Point tangles with Gold Hill and Rogue River mixes with Jacksonville as the hoop contingents of the four schools vie on the Medford floor this evening in the preliminary round for the Southern Oregon Class "B" league championship and the right to contend with the Klamath-Lake county titlist for a berth in the state tourney at Arlington. The initial encounter will start at 7 p. m.

Winners of tonight's battle meet tomorrow evening for the crown.

Although Rogue River came in second in the league's division two race, its general season record establishes it as a heavy favorite in the play-off. Kingpin Bruce Davidson, confined with the flu when the Rogues fell before Eagle Point Friday, should be back in uniform tonight.

Central Point lost only to Rogue River to lead division two but bucked through several contests by narrow margins after a poor pre-conference showing. Jacksonville in an off-again, on-again season lost only twice, winning the division one bracket. Looming as a dark-horse is Gold Hill, which engaged in a dogfight with Phoenix and Butte Falls for a play-off berth. The Beavers have displayed steady improvement since early in the year and can be counted upon to furnish the favorites with stiff opposition.

Beavers Have Four Unsigned Players

San Jose, Cal., Feb. 26.—(U.P.) The Portland Beavers still had four unsigned players today, including Pitchers Dick (Kewpie) Barrett, who was obtained from the Phillies at the close of last season.

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VANDALS CAPTURE 50-46 WIN OVER OREGON WEBFOOTS

Moscow, Ida., Feb. 26.—(U.P.)—University of Idaho maintained its slim lead in the Northern Division Pacific Coast Conference basketball race today following a 50 to 46 win over Oregon last night.

Idaho needs two more victories to clinch the division title and win the right to meet the University of California, southern division champs, in the play-off for the conference crown March 8-9.

Idaho meets Oregon again tonight and Washington State Saturday in the season's finale. Should the Vandals drop either one of their remaining games and second-place Oregon State win its final game with Oregon Saturday, Idaho and Oregon State would finish in a tie.

The Vandals took an early lead last night and never lost it, although the Beavers tied the score once in the first half and again early in the second period. Idaho led 29 to 27 at halftime.

FAVORITES KEEP TOURNEY PLACES

Denver, Feb. 26.—(U.P.)—The American League basketball tournament entered its second round today with league favorites still out in front after the opening matches.

In yesterday's three game playoff the Denver Ambrose Jellymakers walked away from the Los Angeles Shamrocks in the third period to win 57 to 37. The first half of the game was an air-tight battle with both teams scoring what they could with long shots toward the baskets.

Earlier the sharp-shooting Dardi team of San Francisco won a 58 to 44 decision over the Salt Lake City Desert-Simplots and the Kansas City M & O Smokies overran the Sacramento Senators to the tune of 67 to 52.

Ophir high school, in Curry county, with an average attendance of less than 20, and its total faculty consisting of two women, will enter a team, according to Miss Nellie Shepherd, principal of Ophir high school, a graduate of S.O.C. and of the University of Oregon.

Arcadia, Calif., Feb. 26.—(U.P.) Maine Chance farms took over second place in the Santa Anita race track owner standings today by virtue of a double victory in the \$100,000 Santa Anita derby.

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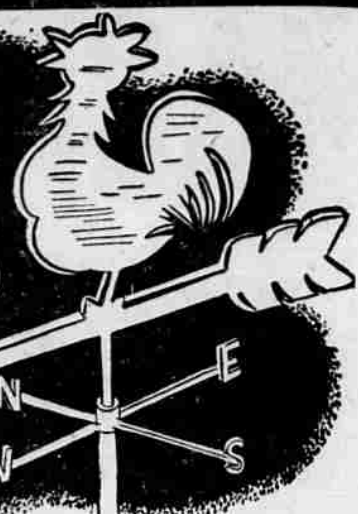
