Navy Officers To Be Trained At School

Instructors are needed in schools for reserve officer candidates which will be opened next summer at the naval training station in Newport, R. I., and the naval station at San Diego, the 13th naval district director of naval reserve announced today.

The navy wants applications from commanders, lieutenant commanders, lieutenants, and lieutenants (junior grade) qualified to teach navigation, naval orientation, naval weapons, leadership, seamanship, and communications.

Enlisted ratings of boatswain's mates, gunner's mates, yeomen, personnel men, disbursing clerks, quartermaster, storekeepers, electrician's mates, hospital corpsmen, and stewards are needed. Duty would last about eight weeks beginning June 26.

Applications should be directed to the chief of naval personnel via commandant, 13th naval district, 1611 West Wheeler street, Seattle 99, Wash. They should be submitted by March 15.

Central Point School Program Postponed

Central Point, Jan. 16.—The upper grade school program planned for Tuesday this week has been postponed to Thursday, January 19, Principal C. A. Meyer said today.

He stated that weather forced postponement, pointing out that a large number of students and parents reside a considerable distance from the school and might not be able to attend the program under present conditions.

Washington, Jan. 16.—(U.P.)—The senate interior committee today unanimously approved the nomination of Oscar L. Chapman to be secretary of interior.

The nomination now goes to the senate floor where it will almost certainly win speedy approval.

The 53-year-old lawyer has served in the department for 18 years, first as an assistant secretary and later as under-secretary. President Truman gave him a recess appointment as secretary December 1, after the resignation of Julius A. Krug.
