Seattle Man Paces Golf

Long Beach, Cal., Jan. 20—(U.P.)—Golf's top stars teed off today in the upper bracket of the \$10,000 Long Beach open split first round with a mark of 69 as their target.

R. J. Connolly of Seattle, a comparative unknown, shot that 2-under-par round yesterday in the lower bracket despite a heavy fog that cut visibility at times to 25 yards.

Because of the bulky field of 327 starters, tournament sponsors divided them into upper and lower brackets. The top 120 players from the two days of play will go into the second round tomorrow.

Connolly, coming from the Pacific northwest where fog and rain are not uncommon, breezed through his round late in the afternoon. His steady, methodical play ate up the Lakewood course and he sank numerous long putts.

But the big names, including Los Angeles open playoff winner Sam Snead, were in today's group.

Chicago, Jan. 20—(U.P.)—The biggest fight crowd of the season was expected tonight for the International Boxing Club's Chicago stadium card featuring a 10-round overweight non-title match between Lightweight Champion Ike Williams and Welterweight Johnny Bratton.

Williams, who was expected to weigh in at about 140, was an 8 to 5 favorite over the Chicago fighter, who has won his last six fights by knockouts.

Bratton, under the contract, has to weigh under 147. Approximately 12,000 fans were expected to pay about \$50,000 to see the brawl.

San Diego, Cal., Jan. 20—(U.P.)—Pacific Coast Baseball league directors took no official action yesterday on televising of major league games despite fears it may cut PCL attendance, says Loop President Clarence Rowland.

Individual clubs in the Coast league were left to make arrangements for televising of their own PCL games.

Directors gave the July league all-star game to Sacramento after the Solons won the right to stage the contest on a flip of a coin with San Diego.

They also voted to draw the \$80,000 playoff fund out of general admissions of the league. First place in the loop will be worth \$40,000, second \$20,000, third \$12,500 and fourth \$7,500.

Snow Depths In Mountains Now Up To Last Year's

Snow depths in the Cascade mountains are now at about the same level as at this time last year, according to W. T. "Jack" Frost, hydraulic engineer with the cooperative federal-state snow survey here.

Frost recently completed a trip throughout the mountain area and has received reports from four different areas in the mountains of southern Oregon, and while the reports do not have the official standing of the monthly winter snow surveys, they are indicative that the heavy snows and rains of the past two weeks have brought the total well above the deficiency noted at the first of the year.

Depths Told
A total of 31½ inches of snow, packed and watered down from a total of 46 inches last Wednesday, was reported from Hyatt Prairie, Frost said. The temperature was 39 above zero there yesterday. At Lake O' Woods, snow depth yesterday was 21 inches, down from 48 last week. Temperature was 29. Fifty-two inches of snow was reported from Diamond lake, compared to 61 last week. An inch of rain has fallen in the last few days.

Snow Packed
Bob Baumont of the snow survey office and Les Marshall of the Medford Irrigation dis-

trict traveled to the Dead Indian watershed Wednesday and reported that there were 61 inches of snow at the summit of the Dead Indian-Lake O' Woods road. There were indications that the snow had been piled up to a depth of eight feet, they said.

On Tuesday, snow depth on the Willamette pass summit was 94 inches, containing 25 inches of water, and on the Santiam pass summit depth was 132 inches away from the highway, with 35½ inches of water. Frost reported.

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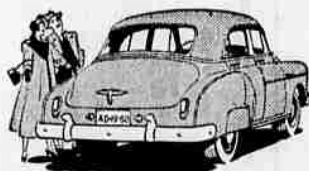
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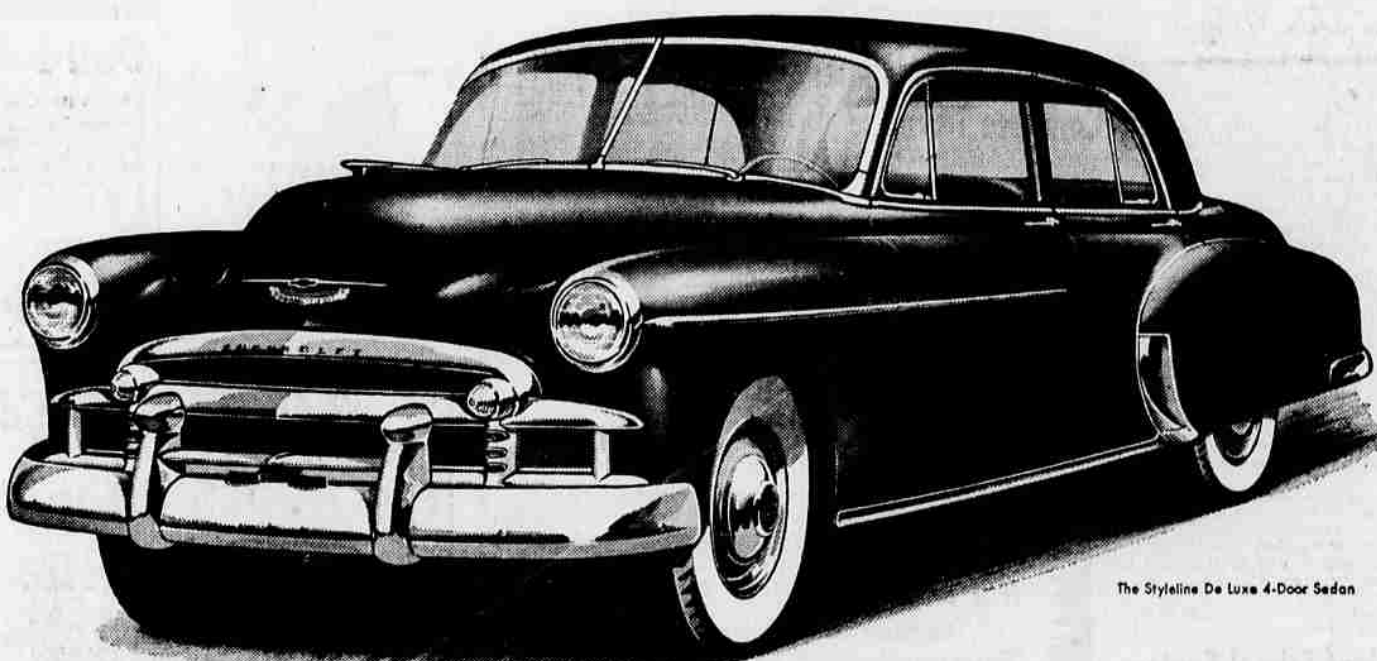
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
