St. Louis—(U.P.)—During the last war, 23-year-old Elmer S. Dolan was assigned to the medical corps because he said he wasn't "interested in guns."

When he had finished there were 50 bullseyes in the target 20 yards away—a perfect score and a new school record.

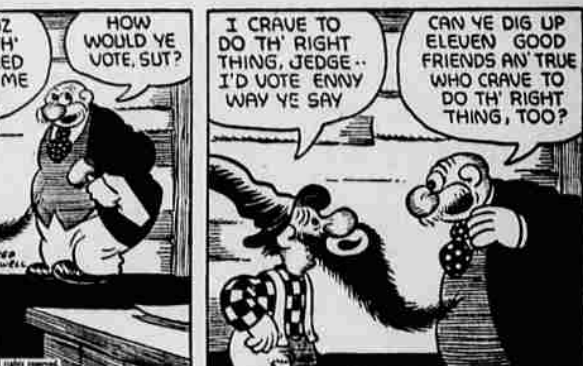
