S. airmen were on her team, will spark the national March of Dimes campaign with an appearance on the department of defense's ABC network broadcast series "Time For Defense" tonight at 8 o'clock over Station KYJC.

Flown to the U. S. from Newfoundland by MATS (Military Air Transportation Service), Marion Hawco, nine-year-old polio victim, will be heard on the program along with a recorded message from Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, urging support for the campaign. USAF Chaplain Volney M. Sink, one of Marion Hawco's benefactors, also will be heard.

Walter Kiernan, noted newspaperman and commentator on the ABC "One Man's Opinion" Phillip Morris program, has been awarded an honorary degree of doctor of comedy and made a director of the Museum of Modern Wit.

The newspaperman, who recently celebrated his twenty-fifth year covering top stories and hobnobbing with celebrities, received the honors from the Gag Writers Institute of America. "One Man's Opinion" may be heard over KYJC Monday through Friday from 2:55 to 3 p.m.

VITE MEANS BETTER THAN AVERAGE HEALTH

My definition of vite—after all it is my word and Webster has not discovered it yet—is as follows:

Preservation of the characteristics of youth; better than a average nutritional condition as manifested in a lower death rate, better growth and development, extension of the prime of life in both directions, material improvement of the life expectation of adults, higher average level of positive health throughout the life cycle, greater pep, more vitality, the highest de-

gree of natural immunity, an adequate fund of reserve power to tide over emergencies and strains, the resiliency of the untamed animal or the primitive savage.

In other words, vite is the difference between the individual who is just "not complaining" and the one who enjoys being alive.

As the mother of a young college girl described it, the girl was bubbling over, now—she had been moping for a year or more when mother wrote for instructions for giving her a suitable daily ration of something which is essential for good nutrition but which most Americans fail to get in their daily food—iodine.

It would be fine and dandy if everybody could gain or regain vite by simply taking a wee-ween bit of iodine every day. The Iodin Ration (send stamped self-addressed envelope and ask for the pamphlet in writing—a clipping will bring no reply) has indeed dispelled the mopefulness that prevents a good many teenage girls from enjoying life as healthy girls do. But iodine is only one of the nutritional essentials which are deficient in the everyday diet of most Americans. The others are calcium, phosphorus, thiamine, riboflavin and vitamin D.

Ideally one should get adequate amounts of all of these essentials of good nutrition from the everyday diet, but actually few if any of us can depend on the food we get today to supply even minimum requirements—that is, the amounts of the vitamins and minerals which are necessary to prevent manifestations of nutritional deficiency disease. In the pamphlet Young Folks and Old Folks (for copy send self-addressed envelope and ask for it in writing) I tell which foods are especially important as sources of the vitamins and minerals most commonly lacking and how to supplement the ordinary diet so as to insure an adequate daily ration of the essentials.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS
Step-son, 8, wets the bed every night. His grandmother has him a yoyo and told him he had weak kidneys and so couldn't help it. We had him to two doctors and he said nothing wrong with his kidneys, but will just have to be punished. We have punished him every way we know how. R. H.
Answer—I don't believe a reputable doctor would advise punishment for a child for bed-wetting, even just a step-child. Too bad the boy can't go back to grandma. At least she was kind to him.
