

Circuit Judge Once Pardoned By FDR Again Faces Embezzlement Charges

Sullivan, Ind., Jan. 26—(U.P.) A circuit judge pardoned by the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt for a forgery conviction today faced bad check and embezzlement charges.

Judge Norval K. Harris, co-chairman with Singer Paul Robeson of a committee that protested the trial of 11 communist leaders last summer, was indicted yesterday by his own grand jury.

After studying the indictment in court, Harris told the grand jurors that "undoubtedly the recent publicity over my stand on civil rights had a lot to do with this."

Funds Appreciated
Prosecutor John K. Purcell said the indictment charged that Harris appropriated a \$100 check sent through his office as an alimony payment to a divorcee.

The indictment charged, further, that Harris tried to cover the alleged embezzlement by is-

suing a check for \$150 on his own bank, in which he had insufficient funds.

Harris denied the charges. "I hope you have lived up to your oath and conducted your investigation without malice or ill feeling toward anyone," he told the grand jurors.

Seems Strange
"It seems strange to me that the grand jury should meet, deliberate a week and then return indictments only against the judge of the circuit court."

Harris disqualifies himself at Purcell's request, and the prosecutor said he would ask the Indiana supreme court to appoint a special judge.

Harris, a democrat, took office a year ago after his election to a six-year term. His republican opponent, Amorine Wilson, filed suit contesting the election because Harris served seven months in the federal penitentiary at Chillicothe, O., in 1932

MacArthur Honored With Medal Of Honor

Manila, P. I., Jan. 26—(U.P.) Gen. Douglas MacArthur has been awarded the Philippines highest military decoration, the Legion of Honor of the Chief Commander, for "eminently meritorious and exceptionally service rendered to the people and government of the Philippines in positions of great responsibility."

Acting on orders from President Elpidio Quirino, Maj. Gen. M. N. Castaneda, armed forces chief of staff, announced the award on MacArthur's 70th birthday.

on a charge of forging veterans' names to government checks.

Harris countered with a \$100,000 slander suit charging that Wilson called him a communist during the election campaign. Both suits later were dismissed.

President Roosevelt pardoned Harris in 1941, nine years after he served the prison term. The pardon restored Harris' right to hold public office.

Mrs. Belle Milton, Early Settler Of Evans Creek, Dies

Rogue River, Jan. 26—Death brought to a close the long and colorful life of another pioneer of Evans Creek when Belle Milton, age 94, died January 23, at her home on West Evans Creek. She was born at South English, Ind., in 1855. She and her husband, the Rev. William Milton, moved to Oregon in 1889 and settled on West Evans Creek near the site of the swinging bridge, where for many years the Rev. Milton preached and ministered to the spiritual needs of the settlers.

The Milton ranch was one of the first to be irrigated under the "Old Mill" ditch in the early days. Though fire destroyed, in recent years, the old two-story house that was home to their nine children, some of the original apple trees and parts of the rose garden remain and are carefully tended by the present owners, Mr. and Mrs. A. G. Shepard, who fully appreciate the quaint varieties of the old fashioned roses which Belle Milton planted around the door of her home when she was a young woman.

Rose In Lapel
Her daughters tell of the Rev. Milton plucking one small perfect pink rose from a certain bush in Belle's garden to wear in his lapel each Sunday morning through the long years of his ministry. And Belle's garden furnished rose cuttings for the homes of the young couples who were married by the Rev. Milton as well as the brides' bouquets.

The deceased leaves five daughters, Mrs. Lillie Dennis, Miss Ethel Milton, Mrs. Ella Magler, Mrs. Ollie Beck of Rogue River, and Mrs. Annie Owens of Central Point. There are two sons, James Milton of Hometown, Ia., and Albert Milton of Grants Pass. There are 18 grandchildren, 38 great-grandchildren and 9 great-great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were to be held today at 2 at the Church of God, with interment in Rogue River cemetery.

Twelve Local Men Join Air Forces

Three of the men have had former military experience. Trimble as a sergeant who spent five months overseas, and who is re-entering the armed forces as a corporal; DeLisle, who was a sergeant, and Wood, who was a pfc, both of whom are enlisting as privates.

Sergeant Davis said there will be several openings during February, and those interested in an army or air force career were urged to get in touch with him.
