Demaret Top Man Phoenix Golfing Open

Phoenix, Ariz., Jan. 28—(U.P.)—Colorful Jimmy Demaret perfected his third sub-par round today to hold a healthy two-stroke lead in the \$10,000 Ben Hogan open.

His two-under-par 69 coupled with previous rounds of 64 and 67 gave him a 54-hole 200 total—one stroke better than the three-quarter mark of South African Bobby Locke who set the tournament record of 268 at the Phoenix country club course in 1948.

Vines Ties Record

Surprising Ellsworth Vines of Chicago, Ill., former national amateur and professional tennis champion, came out of nowhere today to tie the 18-hole course record of 64, which together with previous rounds of 68 and 70 gave him 202.

Meanwhile diminutive Ben Hogan, Hershey, Pa., faltered to a two-over-par 73. Although he was out in a one-under-par 35, Little Ben scrambled his way home with a 38.

Sam Snead, Greenbrier, W. Va., and Johnny Palmer, Badin, N.C., were close behind the leaders and still in contention with 54-hole totals of 204. Palmer, one of the tourney's most consistent shotmakers, carded a par 71 today, while Snead added a 69 to his earlier rounds of 66-69.

Wrestling Card Being Arranged

Promoter Mack Lillard said yesterday that he had several telegrams out in an effort to secure an outstanding opponent for the Great Atlas in the main event of next Thursday night's wrestling card at the armory.

Lillard said he is attempting to sign Georges Dusette but up to late last night Atlas had not given his consent to the match.

The promoter also said he hoped to have Lee Grable, the flashy Hollywood wrestler who went to a draw with Dusette last week, back for another match. Lee Wallick, who unleashed a powerful piledriver against Billy Fox last week, is another possibility for this week's card, Lillard said.

'Ponder' Anita Winner Over Stablemate Horse

Arcadia, Cal., Jan. 28—(U.P.)—Ponder, winner of last spring's Kentucky Derby, and his stablemate, the great filly Two Lea, ran one-two today to give Calumet farm a smashing victory in the \$100,000 Santa Anita Maternity.

The stretch-running Ponder, at his best over a route, finished a full length in front of Two Lea, who had a clear lead over Mocopo, the third horse. Curandero was fourth in the nine-horse field.

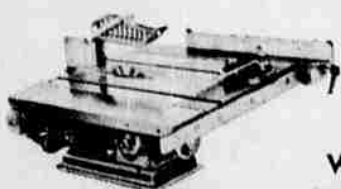

Medford Given Break In Far West Schedule

Medford would seem to have received several breaks in its favor in regard to scheduling Far West Baseball league games, a study of the schedule released by Business Manager Mel Carpenter of the Nuggets revealed.

For instance, the local ball park will be the scene of the north vs. south all-star game July 10 (Monday), the Nuggets will end the season for Medford fans

against three topflight clubs and both Reno and Eugene—new in the league—appear here early.

Medford's pro baseball club—whatever it will be called as a nickname this coming season—opens at home against Marysville May 2 and will remain here through May 7 with Willows following Marysville into the city.

The local Far West league season will close September 5 and 6 when Redding will be in town for two games.

Previous to the final Redding appearance here, Klamath Falls and Eugene will be in Medford for six games each.

Medford's pro club will end the season away from town at Klamath Falls September 10 with a doubleheader.

Many Doubleheaders

This season will see many more doubleheaders scheduled with all but one or two for the local pro club coming on Sundays and holidays. Every Sunday but one or two will have a doubleheader, whether Medford is playing here or away.

Longest visit in Medford the local boys sponsored by Rogue Valley Baseball, Inc., will be from July 4 to July 13 inclusive, which will include two doubleheaders and the all-star game. Medford will have a 10-day stretch out of town from June 9 to June 19.

Medford opens the season at Pitsburg where it will be April 26, 27 and 28 and then follows a three-game series at Reno April 29 and 30 with a twin bill April 29 before the Oregon club goes to Medford to open its home season.

Negro Quint Plays At C.P. Tuesday Eve

Central Point, Jan. 28—The famous Colored Ghosts basketball team will play the Rogue River Chinooks of the Medford AAU Basketball league in the Central Point high gym Tuesday at 8 p. m. following a prelim at 7:15 between fourth and fifth grade school quintets.

This game between the well-known Negro quintet and the Rogue River town team is being sponsored by the high school at Central Point with proceeds going to its athletic fund.

Comedy Big Feature

Comedy is always the prime feature of a game the Colored Ghosts play but the youths also have a thorough knowledge of basketball fundamentals and can defeat most teams they meet. Truly the Negro outfit are clowns from the opening whistle to the closing buzzer.

They pull all kinds of stunts from passing the ball between their legs to step ladder tricks, slow-motion variations, football and baseball stunts, magic-like ball-handling and keeping the ball generally where the opponent does not expect it.

The Colored Ghosts have won 61 out of 63 games played so far this season.

Playing against every type of opposition throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico, the negro team compiled a record of 143 straight victories last season and finished the year without a single loss.

Opposing the Ghosts will be the first half champions of the league 1 in Medford's AAU basketball loop. The Rogue River quintet has many ex-high school players of top ability.

High School Boxing Team Fights Friday

Medford high school boxers will make their public debut here Friday, February 3, when they meet amateur fighters from Grants Pass high in a 12 to 15 bout card billed for 8 p. m.

Coach Fred Spiegelberg of the Tornado team reminded fans here Saturday.

Twenty youths, including 10 who boxed last year and eight of whom won titles, have been working out for about two months getting ready for the season here.

Champions back include Mickey Loros, now weighing 127 pounds who is 1949 champ in 132 pound class; Dean Pratt at 127 who won 112 pound title in 1949; Steve Crippen now at 143 who is 138 pound champ from the 1949 season; and Ken Phillips at 145 the same as last year.

Also on the championship list for Medford are Leonard Stegge, at 155 who was 155 pound titleholder; Don Vincent, 176 light-heavyweight champ; Leo Parker, 220, heavyweight champ, and Ken Watson at 123 who was 118-pound titleholder in 1949.

Two boys back this year did some boxing in 1949 and one of them was a runner-up in the 127-pound class to the champion, Bill Neely is the runner-up from

last year while the other boy back is Coe Brown at 110 pounds. Neely weighs in at 135 pounds this season.

Others who may see action at the senior high gym Friday evening include Justin Smith (110 pounds), Royal Johnson (118), Norman Deming (155), Wayne Tyver (160), Gayle Christlieb (150), Chuck Chitwood (133), Duane Cleaves (130), Norman Love (160), Paul Blair (145) and Lee Lucas (135).

Coach Spiegelberg said that the boxing show will be open to the public Friday and will be the first in a series of two or three such inter-school team boxing matches planned.

A return team match with Grants Pass is tentatively scheduled at the Cavenen's city for February 22 and another will send the local boys against Springfield here February 7.
