

Pels Top Stubbhorn Eagle Point, 44 to 28

Eagle Point, Jan. 28—Don't take this Eagle Point high basketball team lightly for it has spark, fire and a deceptive type of offense in which it is hard to know just where the ball is going to be or where a shot will come from.

Klamath Falls may have defeated the Eagles 44 to 28 last Friday night but the Eagles gave the taller and smoother-working Pels a good lesson in ball-stealing and driving offense for the first and much of the third quarter.

Rebounds Controlled
Superiority under the two baskets all the evening with the Pels getting 99 per cent of the rebounds helped them to victory. The fact the Eagles scored but one point in the second quarter to 10 for Klamath aided also.

Eagle Point took the lead in the first quarter when Pat Simmons and Dick Mulhollen sank free throws with two minutes played but that was the only time the Eagles led. The score read but 9 to 7 for the Pels at the end of the first quarter, however.

Klamath led 19 to 9 at the half, 30 to 17 at the third period whistle and 36 to 24 at the automatic timeout.

Simmons Sparks

Simmons not only was high point man for the team coached by Shirley Callaghan but also sparked the Eagles all the evening and proved a tricky ball-handler. Loss of Mulhollen and Lloyd Hale via the five-four route hurt late in the fourth quarter the Eagles chances.

It was Eagle Point's first Southern Oregon conference-district 4 defeat of the 1949-50 season and the first time the Eagles had lost any basketball game since Coquille edged them 45 to 43 late in December at Eagle Point.

Eagles Still Lead

The Eagles still hold a four win and no loss edge in the Jackson-Douglas-Josephine county conference.
