

Final Fishing Rules For Oregon Adopted

Portland, Ore., Jan. 31.—(U.P.) Final fishing regulations for 1930 as adopted by the Oregon state game commission retained the staggered trout season as proposed in tentative rules announced January 16.

The general trout season will open April 15 west of the Cascades and May 1 east of mountains. Season will close October 15 throughout the state.

The final regulations were adopted by the commission Saturday. Changes in tentative regulations included:

In zone one, opening for salmon fishing in Nehalem river, Salmonberry river, north fork of the Salmonberry, Rock creek, Wilson river, Trask river and north fork of the Trask will be October 1, instead of October 15. Closing date for winter fishing on the Nehalem river will be February 28. Bag limit on catfish in Ten Mile lake was eliminated.

In zone three, an open season was set for Lost Lake in Linn county, June 1 to 30.

Zone Two Changes

In zone two, season for Gold lake will be June 1 to 10, inclusive. Herman creek up to Highway bridge 30 will be closed to salmon fishing from August 15 to October 20.

In zone four, the ban on night catfishing on the Rogue river and its tributaries was eliminated. The steelhead bag limit was set at two fish a day, not more than five a week, and not more than 20 a year, provided that not more than 10 can be taken before August 15.

In zone five, Little Lava lake was opened to angling. Rock creek reservoir will be opened May 1. Opening date for Fawn, Wahoo and Rosary lakes was changed to June 1 from June 10. The season for North Twin lakes will be May 1 to September 15, inclusive. At Wickup reservoir the season will be May 1 to September 30, inclusive.

Zone 7 Has Changes

In zone seven, the Walla Walla river will be opened to steelhead and salmon fishing the entire year. Trout season for north fork of the Walla Walla and its tributaries will be May 1 to June 30, inclusive.

In zone eight, Bridge and Mud creeks open season will be June 1 to September 30, inclusive.

In zone nine, Pine creek below confluence of north fork will be open to salmon and steelhead fishing the entire year.
