YOUR HEALTH AND ITS CARE

THE PATIENT versus THE DOCTOR
With the single exception of Pasteur treatment, if I were the patient I'd do as my doctor advised, whether the doctor's views or methods happened to be in accord with mine or not.

If I were bitten, clawed, scratched or wounded by a snake, a bird or person suspected of having rabies I'd submit to any treatment my doctor might deem necessary—except Pasteur treatment. If the doctor insisted on that, we'd agree in a friendly way that the doctor withdraw in favor of another doctor who might be willing to treat me without Pasteur treatment.

It is not that I KNOW any more about alleged rabies in man or about the effects of injections of Pasteur or so-called antirabic virus than any other doctor knows, but I'd rather take my chances without it than all.

Last year I was seized with a chill, fever, cough, sharp chest pains. The doctor found I had pneumonia. I had a ride to the hospital in a beautiful new ambulance which had everything except a lily for my epigastrium. I had a darn good doctor who administered the first dose of two of antibiotic himself and left the subsequent doses to the nurses. The miracle medicine stopped the infection in four days. Nothing to it after that except to wait for the rales and consolidation in the bases to clear up. Recovery was uneventful.

I say my doctor was a good one. I still think so, although you could have knocked me over with a feather when I woke up in the hospital and found (a) all windows closed; (b) a ridiculous diaper-like garment of muslin on my chest, which the nurse called a "pneumonia jacket"; and (c) every night and morning my chest was rubbed, not with snake oil or goose-grease exactly but with a nostrum familiar to millions of credulous customers as "Dr. J. C. Doan's Kidney Pills."

Let's say "O!" Doctor Hokum's Strong Smelling Salve. But just suppose you are ill of some acute respiratory infection. Suppose your doctor diagnoses pneumonia. And suppose your
