Chicago Discovers Better House Way In Building Code

Chicago—(U.P.)—A "modernized" building code is expected to provide housing for many more persons in the nation's second most populous city.

The code, approved by unanimous vote of the city council, was hailed by Leverett Lyon, chief executive officer of the Chicago Association of Commerce and Industry, as an "important step for great economy and efficiency."

Estimates of the number of dwelling units that could be provided under the less restrictive rules ran up to 25,000. Lyon said the new code would be "a good model for other cities with outmoded building regulations."

Inside City Limits
Prefabricated houses for the first time can be built inside the city limits. Plywood, wallboard and other materials that meet certain tests can be used in home construction.

The flexibility of the new code allows builders to use any of more than 80 combinations of various materials that meet health and safety tests. Previously they had to choose from a list of seven specified by city ordinance.

Cost Not So High
"Builders in Chicago now can take advantage of new housing developments," Lyon said. "At the same time, manufacturers will be encouraged to develop even better, less costly, more efficient materials."

How changes are applicable in the area outside the city's "fire limits," the most congested area around the Loop district. This area takes up about 36 of the city's 211 square miles.

Sod House Ranked Best For Nebraska
Broken Bow, Neb.—(U.P.)—In 1889, Milt Whitney brought his new bride from Iowa to a sod house near here. Sixty years later, Mr. and Mrs. Whitney still are living in a sod house and they won't live any place else.

Whitney, now 84, and his 83-year-old wife, Annie, refuse to leave the comfort of their home, although they could move into a more modern house.

"Our daughter and son just about have fits," said Milt. "But this is where I brought Annie in 1889 from Iowa. We learned that we could stay if we made something from nothing."

Rents Out Land
From nothing, the Whitneys have built up a quarter-section farm and equipment. Now Whitney rents out most of the land.

But they still continue to live on the farm. They started out with a one-room "soddy," but now they live in a five-room house finished just after World War I.

"I call this place 'Poverty Hill,'" Whitney said. "It looks like sin on the outside, but it's comfortable. Sod is a good insulator."

"I wouldn't die any place but in this old sod house," said Mrs. Whitney.

Eisler Believed Directing Blockade
Berlin, Feb. 2.—(U.P.)—Gerhart Eisler is one of three top German communists believed directing the new baby blockade of Berlin, west German sources said today.

Eisler, former top communist agent in the United States, escaped to Germany after stowing away on the Polish ship Batary out of New York last year.

The political editor of the British-sponsored German paper Die Welt said Eisler and two other communists had been appointed to an action committee to direct the baby blockade.

He identified the other two as Walter Ulbricht, reputedly the Kremlin favorite in Germany, and Fritz Ebert, communist mayor of east Berlin and son of

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Your Child's Teeth

Following is the fifth in a series of question and answer articles submitted by the Southern Oregon Dental Society, in observance of National Children's Dental Health day, Monday, Feb. 6.

At what age should a child begin brushing his teeth?
When all the primary teeth have erupted, which is usually between the ages of two and three years.

Should a parent help the child with his toothbrushing?
Yes. In fact the parent will have to do most of the real brushing for some time. The child should be permitted to wield the brush first and then the parent should take over and complete the job. In this way the child will develop the habit of regular toothbrushing.

What is the best method of brushing the teeth?
There are several approved methods. One good method is this: With the jaws held slightly apart, brush the teeth of each jaw separately. Place the bristles on the gum and brush the upper teeth with a downward motion. Reverse the procedure for the lower teeth, brushing upward. Give at least five strokes to each group of teeth covered by the brush. The grinding surfaces should be cleaned with a scrubbing motion. It is important to brush the tooth surfaces that touch the tongue as well as those that touch the cheeks.

When should the teeth be brushed?
To obtain the best results, the brushing should be done immediately after eating whenever possible, because food debris that adheres to the teeth is one source of tooth decay. This is especially true of sweets.

Which is better, tooth powder or paste?
There is no essential difference in the cleansing properties of tooth powder and tooth paste. For children a paste is probably preferable because it is easier to handle and therefore less subject to waste.

Does gum chewing help or harm the teeth?
There is no evidence that gum

chewing benefits the teeth in any way. On the other hand there is evidence that sugarcakes contribute to dental decay and chewing gum contains sugar.
