

Rogue Fish Regulations Reviewed by Game Group

Grants Pass, Feb. 4—The Oregon state game commission has adjusted tentative regulations announced previously with only minor changes made as applied to the Rogue watershed (Zone 4). The ban on night fishing for catfish in the waters of the Rogue was eliminated. The commission reconsidered this former regulation because much recreation is available with night fishing for catfish.

The commission believes more law enforcement will be necessary to curtail violations of taking trout while under the guise of fishing for catfish. If anglers on Rogue river will respect the closures to trout, there is no need for similar closures to night fishing in the future, it was stated.

The proposed punch tag for salmon and steelhead over 20 inches in length was adopted to limit the take of these larger fish to 20 per year. The free punch card is to be used by Oregon anglers beginning March 1 and extending to Feb. 28, 1951.

Each time a fish over 20 inches in length is caught a punch is removed from the card and the date and river are entered in the space provided immediately after the fish is taken.

The punch card will be available at all game commission license agencies on or about February 25. The cards are to be retained by all anglers until May 31, 1951, in order that the game commission may obtain a sample for a study of the catch.

Specific letters are to be sent to individual anglers requesting the return of their card. Valuable information on management will be worked up from the returned cards, a spokesman said.

The card with its provisions for limiting the catch of steelhead and salmon over 20 inches in length is designed to prevent excessive catches and to distribute the catch to more anglers. Anglers on Rogue river have much to gain with more equal distribution of the catch, officials said.

On Rogue river the bag limit for salmon for the 1950 season will be two fish per day and five per week. The steelhead limit will be three per day and six per week.

Of the catch only 20 salmon and steelhead over 20 inches in length in the aggregate will be allowed provided not more than 10 may be taken before August 15.

The minimum size limits for steelhead will be the same as they were in 1949 but only those over 20 inches in length will require a punch on the card and count toward the annual limit.

The 1949 angling laws will still be enforced until the 1950 regulations are filed with the secretary of state some time next week.

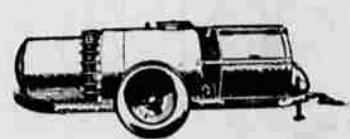
