

Flow At Bonneville Is Above Average

Portland, Ore., Feb. 8—(U.P.)—The Columbia river flow at Bonneville dam rose to 101,000 cubic feet per second today, according to army engineers who said the flow was above average for this time of year.

Although there was considerable melt-off of snow, the engineers said the ice pack above the dam was static.

There has been no navigation through the dam locks since last Friday.

Army engineers at Willamette valley stations reported a slow melting of snow, aided by slightly lower temperatures, had kept the runoff into the Willamette river and its tributaries at an even pace. None of the three completed flood control dams has been put to use yet storing excess water.

Gubitchev Not Linked With Any Spy Plot, Defense Lawyer Says

New York, Feb. 8—(U.P.)—Defense Attorney Abraham L. Pomrenitz charged today that the government's star witness had failed to link Valentin A. Gubitchev, Russian engineer, in any spy plot with government girl Judith Coplon.

The witness was William E. Foley, chief of the internal security and foreign agents registration sections of the department of justice, and Miss Coplon's former boss. Foley testified that he gave Miss Coplon a "decoy" government secret in a justice department experiment to see if it would find its way to Russian hands. Excerpts from the decoy document were found in her purse when she was arrested with Gubitchev on March 4.

Whitford Succeeds Chapin As Marshal At Gold Hill

Gold Hill, Feb. 8—Ray Chapin, who has been the city marshal for the past several months turned his resignation in to the council February 6. He has returned to San Francisco where he has been employed by the Pacific Gas and Electric company.

Carl Whitford was appointed marshal by Mayor Leon Wise and approved by the council. He assumed his duties at once. The council ordered a letter of recommendation sent to Chapin in appreciation of his work here.

A large group of business men and women attended the meeting and after Councilman Molloy explained the purpose of the occupational tax, several expressed opinions about it. The council is drawing up a new ordinance to change the name of the tax which will be adopted at a later date. Amounts of the tax seem to be satisfactory to most of the business people.

Letter Received

A letter was received from the state highway commission asking the city not to sell property along the Sams Valley highway until the highway survey is completed. I. F. Miller is said to be interested in buying lot 8 of the Water Park addition when the highway completes the survey.

Ordinance 262 was adopted by the council to bring a new piece of property into the business district, thereby placing lot 13, block 25 within the business zone. The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company has purchased the lot to build a building there to take care of local business.

Portlander Awarded Added Compensation

Philadelphia, Feb. 8—(U.P.)—A United States district court jury awarded \$150,000 damages to William D. Trowbridge, 46, Portland, Ore., last night in his suit against two Philadelphia firms for injuries suffered in a Portland plant in April, 1945.

The verdict, one of the highest accident case awards in the history of the court here, was against the Abrasive company of Philadelphia, and its successor, the Simonds Abrasive company.

Trowbridge said he was crippled permanently when an abrasive wheel on a portable grinder exploded, nearly severing his legs.

Judge J. Cullen Ganey ruled that \$23,817 Trowbridge received from his employer, the Columbia Steel Castings company of Portland, for medical expenses and workmen's compensation would have to be deducted from the \$150,000.

Norblad Not To Back Communist China

Portland, Ore., Feb. 8—(U.P.)—Oregon Congressman Walter Norblad wrote Matt Meehan, International Longshoremen and Warehousemen's representative, that he would not support recognition of communist China. It was disclosed today.

Meehan had written Norblad asking him to back recognition of the red regime, in order to restore sagging Pacific trade.

Norblad's reply said, "I thoroughly detest the religious and political philosophy of communism and am firmly of the belief that the United States should have no dealings with those adhering to these ideologies."

Norblad labeled the Chinese communist government as "thoroughly unreliable" and "unresponsive."

Revolver Identified As Brink's Weapon

Boston, Mass., Feb. 8—(U.P.)—A rust-covered revolver found behind a suburban barbershop and identified as one taken from guards the night of the Brink's Inc., \$1,700,000 holdup, underwent a microscopic examination today.

The weapon was the first tangible clue in the nation's largest cash robbery. Investigators hoped it would lead to the capture of the nine bandits who vanished after the holdup on January 17.

The .38 caliber revolver, now in the possession of the FBI, was found by rookie Patrolman William Healey of the Somerville police as he checked the rear doors of stores along Mystic avenue in that community.
