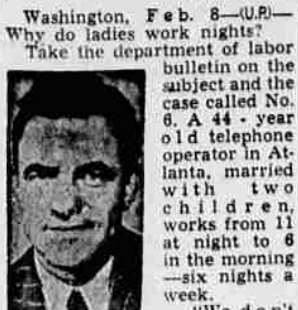


A Nichols' Worth of— Comment On This and That

Newspapers Delete Statistics Addresses

Portland, Ore., Feb. 8—(U.P.)—Portland's two daily newspapers carried birth and death statistics today without address listings because a strict interpretation of an Oregon law was applied.

Deane Huxtable, Oregon registrar of vital statistics, said the move was made as a "protection to the public." A law passed by the state legislature last July makes no reference to listing addresses in vital statistics.

Huxtable said publication of addresses in vital statistics left the way open to annoying calls by salesmen. But one father retorted:

"I can't recall ever having been bothered very much. As the father of five children maybe you could look upon me as the voice of experience."

Toy-Laden Vessel Sails For Rotterdam

Philadelphia, Feb. 8—(U.P.)—The liner American Defender sails for Rotterdam today to bring toyland back to the children of Europe.

Its holds crammed with dolls, wagons and other wonderful gifts, the ship carries the first installment of America's tide-of-toys.

The initial shipment of 800,000 toys will be distributed by CARE representatives in the Netherlands, Austria, Berlin and the three zones of western Germany.

Additional millions of toys, still flowing into the American Legion toyland depot here, will go later to gladden the hearts of play-starved youngsters in France, Italy, the British Isles, Greece and Norway.

American Soldiers Given Prison Terms

Tokyo, Japan, Feb. 8—(U.P.)—Two American soldiers who assaulted two Swedish diplomats and others at a party here last December 2 were handed long prison terms by an army court-martial today.

Pvt. Lawson R. Davis, 22, of Lexington, N. C., was sentenced to 10 years and Pvt. Sanford E. Shackelford, 19, of Newport, Ky., to 5 years.

Davis and Shackelford were charged with staging a near-riot in a local restaurant after members of Scandinavian diplomatic missions attending a party in the restaurant took exception to their remarks to women guests.
