During his 14 years of administration the diocese has experienced tremendous growth and is now on the eve of launching a new program of expansion which will affect many parts of the territory.

In further observance of this occasion laymen of the Southern Oregon deanery, comprising Medford, Ashland, Grants Pass and Roseburg, will gather at Grants Pass Sunday evening when they will be dinner guests of the men of St. Luke's Episcopal church. They will hear visiting laymen of the diocese speak upon proposed new expansion.
