shears, 408 South Grape street. The meeting will convene at 2 p.m.

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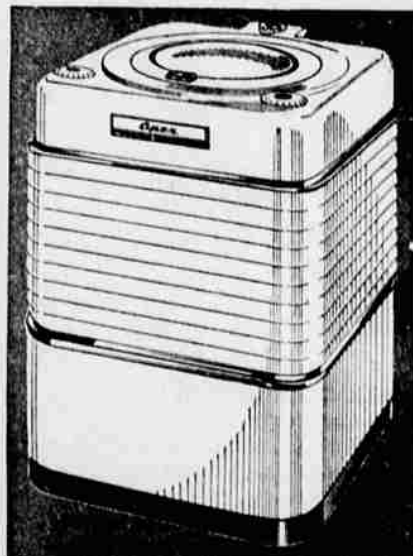
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
