San Antonio, Tex., Feb. 13—(U.P.)—It took the greatest final 36 holes in PGA tournament history to win the \$10,000 Texas open golf championship, but the one-time temperamental prima donna of the fairways, Sam Snead, proved he was the man who could do it.

The 71-year-old "dean of eastern college coaches" said he definitely would not accept a new coaching position again. However, he said he would remain as coach of the East team in the annual East-West Shrine charity game, a position he has held for 23 years.

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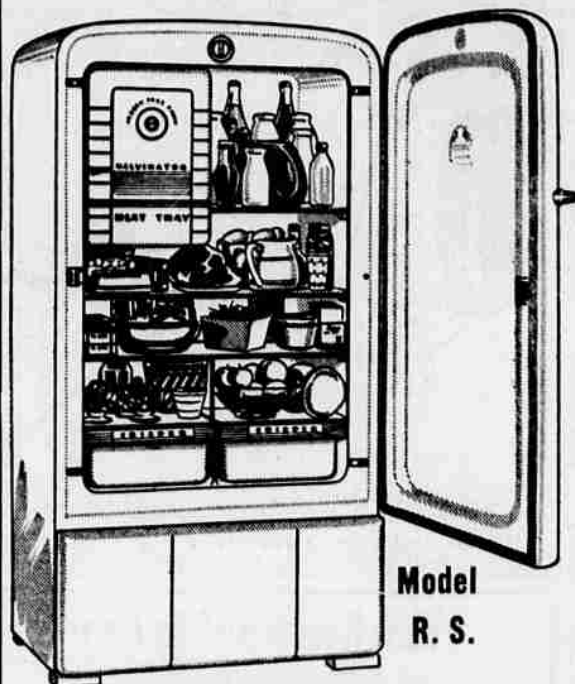
