Washington, Feb. 23.—The head of the powerful Senate public works committee, Sen. Chavez, apparently doesn't think Northwest reclamation projects are very important.



The New Mexican democrat recently assailed the senate interior and insular affairs committee for delaying consideration of the public works rivers and harbors bill by holding hearings to amend the bill to include Columbia basin irrigation projects.

Sen. O'Mahoney, head of the interior and insular affairs committee, answered Chavez's charges by pointing out that the interior committee had not received the green light from the administration on the projects until early this month, and that they had been holding hearings almost daily since then.

Chavez curtly replied, "They (the hearings) referred, did they not, to the Columbia basin?" Or to put it another way, Chavez was suggesting that maybe it was not too important to hold hearings on the Northwest projects at the expense of holding up passage of the omnibus rivers and harbors bill.

The New Mexican senator also implied that the interior and insular affairs committee was attempting to usurp the public works committee's jurisdiction by holding these hearings.

In the midst of an exchange with Sen. O'Mahoney, Chavez announced that "We (this committee) are not going to let any other committee legislate for the committee on public works."

Dean Dunn Tells Of Progress In State Forestry

Oregon, the No. 1 forestry state, starting from scratch 40 years ago has made advancement in development and management of its forest resource and the future outlook is good, according to Paul M. Dunn, dean of the Oregon State college school of forestry, who addressed Kiwanians yesterday at Rogue Valley country club.

Dunn mentioned the "definite cooperation" that has made progress available, and outlined some of the history of better care and utilization of the forest resources. He said the greatest development has come in the past 10 years.

Has No Equal
The speaker said that Oregon's forest protection program has no equal in the United States. Dunn stated that to many people protection means only the effort against fire, but that now attention is also going to diseases and insects, which are increasing.

Oregon is a leader in forest practices, Dunn said. The state has kept pace with legislation, he brought out, pointing to the forest fee and yield tax law, reducing taxes in the years before harvest, and to the conservation law.

Dunn reported that 73 per cent of the Oregon timber is under some plan of sustained yield. He said the state was, perhaps, a bit backward in forest and tree planting.

Essay Contest In Progress, DAV Tells Of Details

The second annual national essay contest sponsored by the president's committee on National Employment the Physically Handicapped week is now in progress. The contest is for high school juniors and seniors throughout the nation on the subject: "Employ the Handicapped, It Pays."

The International Machinists' association and the Disabled American Veterans have provided the money for the national prizes, which are \$400, \$300, \$200 and \$100 for first, second, third and fourth prizes respectively.

Department of Oregon DAV has joined Oregon Machinists' council in supplying state prizes of a \$100 bond for first, \$50 bond for second and a \$25 bond each for third and fourth places in the state contest. These are in addition to the national prizes. Closes March 12.

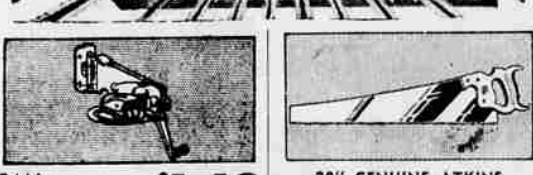
Any student of the 11th and 12th grades is eligible for this contest. The closing date is March 31. All high schools have been notified, but students may enter individually, by complying with the rules of the contest. All essays must be on 8½ by 11 inch paper, typed, double spaced, with two-inch top and bottom space and one-inch side margins. Student's name with the English teacher's signature and the address of the school must be on the stapled cover of the entry, with the title "Hire the Handicapped, It's Good Business."

Further information on this subject may be obtained from the local employment office, state division of vocational rehabilitation, and the local office of the civil service commission. Submit all entries to the state department of education, division of vocational rehabilitation, Salem, Ore. This contest is approved by the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

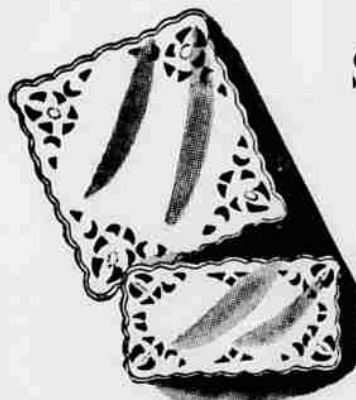
