Order Petersen To Defend Title

Portland, Ore., Feb. 23—(U.P.) Bill Petersen today was under orders by the Portland boxing commission to defend his north-west heavyweight championship within 60 days—or else.

Commission Chairman Ray Smith said Petersen, now in Chicago, would have to give up the title if he did not fight here "shortly." Petersen's last defense of the title was against Hardrock Gordon last November, which ended in a knockout of Gordon.

Meanwhile, Portland Matchmaker Tex Salkeld of the National Boxing club said Petersen told him over the telephone from Chicago he would defend his crown against any west coast heavyweight.

As a result, Salkeld said he would try to match Joe Kahut for a main event bout March 14, against the northwest champion Salkeld has a standing offer to World Heavyweight Champion Ezzard Charles to meet Kahut in a title match here this summer.

Orlando, Fla., Feb. 23—(U.P.) The Orlando mixed two-ball golf championships moved into the second round today with only one of the famous Bauer sisters in action.

Alice Bauer, Marlene's older sister, was eliminated yesterday after forcing her match into an extra hole by missing a 10-foot putt on the 18th green. Katherine Hemphill of Chattanooga, Tenn., and Burl Bolesta of Tampa won the match when Miss Hemphill sank a 20-foot putt on the 19th hole.

Marlene remained in the tournament by teaming with Denny Champagne, the host professional, to beat Bea McWane of Birmingham, Ala., and Clay Gaddie of Cincinnati, 3 and 2.
