Fifth Police Training Class Here Tomorrow

The regional police training program in Medford sponsored by the Oregon Association of City Police Officers and the Oregon State Sheriffs' association in cooperation with the local department will have its fifth class Wednesday.

This class will initiate a 15-hour project involving the handling of a practical problem in burglary from the initial investigation through final court action.

Instructors at the Medford school will be a two-man team consisting of Max Taylor of the federal bureau of investigation and Lt. Paul E. Morgan, department of state police. Local court officials and attorneys will assist in conducting the court proceedings.

Subsequent sessions of the project will be held on March 8, 13 and 15. The project school will complete a 27-hour program of advanced training for city and county law enforcement officers.

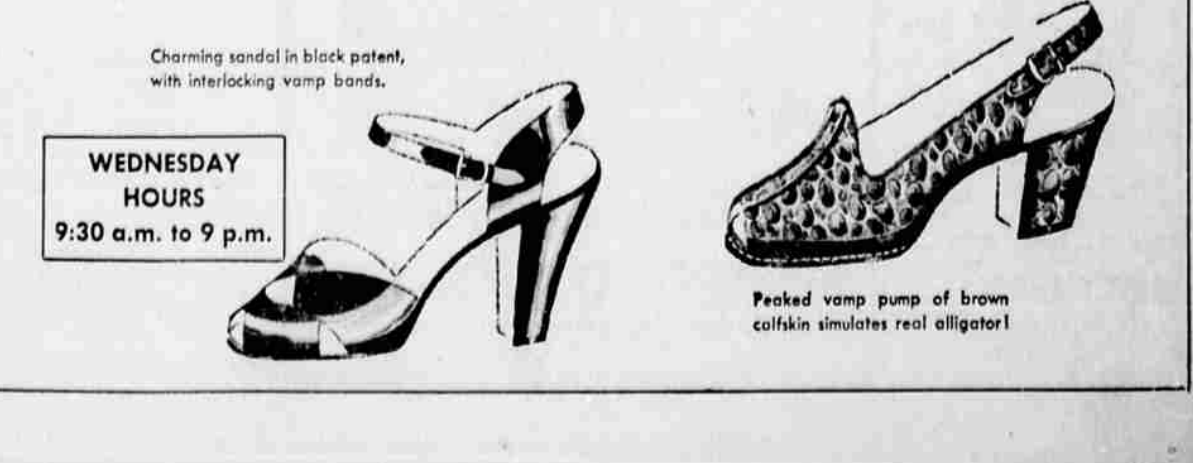
