Ashland Council Reviews Forest Sale, Water Rate

Ashland, Mar. 8 — Ashland city councilmen last night voted to place a charter amendment on the May 19 primary election ballot, which would clear the way for sale of forested lands in Ashland canyon to the forest service. The proposed sale has been discussed for more than a year, and was once approved before legal difficulties held it up.

The special water rate committee recommended to the council that water rates be kept unchanged for a year until results of a new metering plan are determined, but councilmen set a special meeting next Tuesday to discuss the matter further. The question is related to budget matters, which will have to be voted on in May, and councilmen are anxious to get the situation clarified.

Radio station KWIN was granted the right to tape-record council sessions for later broadcast, after Mayor Thomas Williams broke a tie vote to approve the station's request.

Action on a proposed ordinance to place responsibility for juvenile delinquency upon parents was held up pending a supreme court decision on a similar ordinance passed in Eugene. Leads of the city golf course 'was again considered, but action was postponed until councilmen "sound out" community sentiment on the proposal.

Mayor Williams will name members for the non-inactive city planning commission, it was indicated, following explanation of an injunction suit filed recently in regard to a rezoning ordinance. City Attorney Harry Skerry Jr. said that the city had followed improper procedure, and that planning commission approval should have been obtained prior to passage of the ordinance.

Medford Permit Value Up Over Last January

The major portion of building permit values in Medford for January of this year was represented by the \$110,000 permit taken out by the F. W. Woolworth company to remodel and expand its quarters in the Medical Center building. Total permit values here for the month were \$192,625.

That figure was an increase of 162 per cent over construction values for January of 1950 and an increase of three per cent over December, 1949.
