Remodeling Continue At Medical Center

R. J. Crossman, owner of the Medical Center building, has been granted another of a series of building permits for remodeling and renovating the four-story structure. Crossman has been applying for building permits for each phase of the work rather than for the entire project.

The city building inspector's office yesterday granted Crossman a permit for \$5,000 to install a ventilation system for the building. The F. W. Woolworth company was given a \$110,000 permit in January for remodeling and expanding its quarters in the building.

Lucas, \$800 to remodel a residence at 317 West Clark street, and to S. T. Schultz, \$500 to add to a residence at 1019 West Main street.
