'Bad Security Risk' Expose Set By Solon

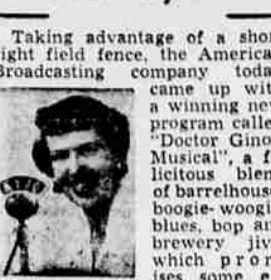
Washington, Mar. 13--(U.P.) Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy shrugged off a blast of criticism from the state department today and announced that on Monday he will name a department big shot he regards as a bad security risk.

The Wisconsin republican promised "phenomenal" disclosures about the official who, he said, holds an "important" state department post. He said the man will be "my first case Monday."

McCarthy refused to identify the official in advance. But he said the case is "infinitely worse" than that of Dorothy Kenyon, the New York lawyer he has charged with communist activities and membership in 28 red fronts.

Miss Kenyon says the senator is an "unmitigated liar" and that she will tell him so to his face when she testifies before a senate subcommittee today.

Mother Slashes Two Children's Throats

Goffstown, N. H., Mar. 13--(U.P.)—A 35-year-old mother slashed the throats of her two small children at the county farm today to save them from being abused.

The children were rushed across the streets to the Hillsborough county hospital where Mrs. Abbie C. Borroto died last Dec. 4, starting the famed Dr. Hermann N. Sander "mercy death" trial.

Among the physicians treating the children was Dr. Albert F. Snay of Goffstown, a principal witness in the trial of Dr. Sander.

According to police and authorities at the county farm, Mrs. Dorothy Drew, wife of a one-year-old daughter Edna Ruth and her son Kenneth, 2, into a bathroom at the farm and slashed their throats with a seven inch knife.

"Sound bombs"—To break civilian morale. "Sound bombs" is a term used for the employment of prolonged high-pitched noises, the full effects of which are not known.

Poison gas—For use against either armies or civilians. There are new "heavy" types which are not dissipated by light winds as in World War I and for which there are no known antidotes. Some of them dissolve the materials usually used in gas masks.

And any or all of these could be carried to the target by guided missiles as well as by conventional planes.

Art of Killing Civilians Leads Death For Soldiers

London, March 13--(U.P.)—If there is another war, you might be safer at the fighting front than at home.

A United Press survey of secret and semi-secret weapons ready for use in the laboratory stage shows that the art of killing civilians is far outpacing that of killing soldiers.

Beating Expected

Soldiers would have plenty of trouble in a new holocaust. They always do, and more or less expect it. But next time, if any, civilians are expected to take the heaviest beating and the heaviest casualties.

Handful of Targets

Actually there is only a handful of targets large enough to warrant its use. Places like New York, Chicago, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Philadelphia or Boston.

A British scientist told the United Press that, barring the hydrogen bomb, he rated the terror weapons of any new war in this order:

Germ bombs—To spread plague and panic in big cities.

What Happens When Hope, Godfrey, Como Attend a Christening.

When one of the country's largest manufacturers recently dedicated the opening of its new factory and research laboratory, the following events took place:

A peaceful, small southern town found neighbors for a few days in Arthur Godfrey, Bob Hope, Perry Como, Eddy (Tennessee Plover) Arnold, Minky Carson, the Fontane Sisters and a score of the country's top musicians.

More than twenty-million radio listeners from coast to coast heard about it in a special full-hour broadcast.

More than 8,000 local citizens jammed the nearby university's gymnasium to witness the special broadcast, starring the new neighbors.

Those that could not fit into the gymnasium crowded the roped-off streets in front of the new factory in a fun- and song-filled jamboree honoring the employees of the company and starring Arthur Godfrey, Bob Hope, Perry Como and the Fontane Sisters.

The town's merchants, in turn, paid tribute to the radio stars at a 2,000-plate banquet.

Full-page advertisements in the country's leading newspapers told laboratory and of the special broadcast.

This big celebration signaled the opening of the world's newest, most modern cigarette factory and research laboratories by the makers of Chesterfield cigarettes in Durham, North Carolina. The new factory is the first modern cigarette-making plant built since before the war and was necessitated by the increasing demand for Chesterfields. 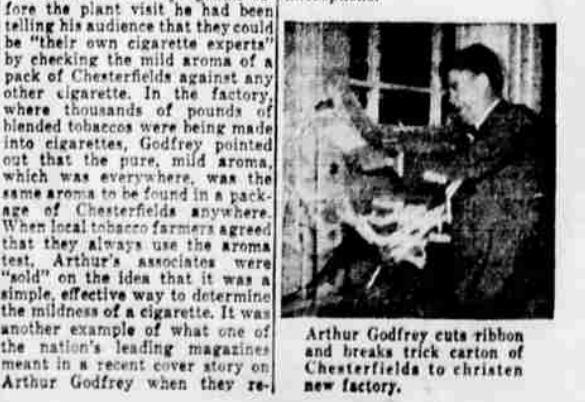
