

NAIB Tourney Continues With First Round Games

Kansas City, Mo., Mar. 14—(U.P.)—The first test of Brooklyn college, rated a strong threat for the title, and the first appearance of high-scoring Nate DeLong of River Falls, Wis. Teachers were expected to highlight first round games today in the NAIB tournament.

The basketball whirl involving 32 teams got under way yesterday with eight first round games and today's eight games will complete the bracket.

The Brooklyn college Kingsmen, who should be a one-point win over St. John's as the highlight of a brilliant season, will take the floor for the first time in an afternoon game against Appalachian State Teachers of Boone, N. C., and were a strong choice to win.

Other day time games are Southeastern Louisiana vs. College of Puget Sound; East Texas State vs. University of South Dakota; and Baldwin-Wallace vs. Kalamazoo.

DeLong, the free wheeling point maker who has set a score of records, will be seen when River Falls clashes with Eastern Illinois State in the final game on the night program.

Other games tonight will be Morningside college of Sioux City, Ia. vs. Arkansas Poly; Delta (Mississippi) State vs. Indiana State Teachers; and Kansas Wesleyan vs. East Central, Okla. State.

Defending champion Hamline university of St. Paul, Minn., made itself a hot favorite to retain the title by trouncing Regis college, 74 to 66.

Also Tampa university whipped New Mexico A. and M., 85-75, Westminster college of New Wilmington, Pa., posted a 70 to 62 victory over New Britain, Conn. Teachers, Davis and Elk.

And if the games follow last night's pattern, in which top seeded Bradley whipped Syracuse, 78 to 66, and fourth-ranked St. John's beat Western Kentucky, 69 to 60, at Madison Square garden, this year's tourney will have a round-of-four made up wholly of seeded teams.

The Wildcats from the Bluegrass country were favored by four points to defeat CCNY but unseeded LaSalle of Philadelphia was a three-point choice to eliminate the Ducks from Pittsburgh.

Survivors of tonight's game will meet in the semi-finals, Thursday, while Bradley will play St. John's.

Both games last night followed almost identical patterns, the Braves from Peoria, Ill., and St. John's racing to victory after the mid-point of the final half, following tight struggles for 30 minutes before a crowd of 17,500.

Two of those attending said their entry would depend on whether a league was organized, that is whether or not enough teams showed enough interest.

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Dodgers Get 'New' Umpire For Practice

Vero Beach, Fla., Mar. 14—(U.P.)—The electronic age hit Dodger Town today.

A cross-eyed "electronic umpire," which not only calls "in" closer than any normally endowed umpire, but does so without fear of argument, was installed in the spring training camp of the Brooklyn Dodgers.

This new gadget in a camp already filled with gadgets was developed for the Dodgers by the General Electric company at Electronics park, Syracuse, N.Y. Improve Pitching.

The immediate objective is to improve pitching and batting techniques. But in the long run, it may become a factor in judging whether young pitching prospects have what it takes to win in the major leagues.

The device, which is not intended to replace umpires in actual games, is able to operate on an overcast day, but not at night. It can register accurately the speed of a pitched ball, provided it is a strike, in feet per second as it passes over the plate.

President Branch Rickey of the Dodgers said that the speedometer may enable scouting staffs to establish the velocity of a major league fast ball allowing them to set specific standards for young pitching prospects.
