Johnson will analyze a young American boy's interpretation of the words of "The Lord's Prayer," and will show how they are disregarded in many parts of the world today where millions of persons are still suffering as a result of World War II and because of a tyranny that has sprung up in many lands.

Mrs. Horton, 32, Chicago, said she last saw her father, W. J. Murphy, when her parents separated at Clinton in 1921.

About a month or so ago, while waiting out a snowstorm in a Clinton restaurant, the woman, proprietor told of Murphy's she knew in Clinton. They turned out to be relatives of Mrs. Horton.

After communicating with several of the relatives by phone and letter Mrs. Horton found her father at Portland, Ore., and the two are arranging a reunion.

Marine Officer To Arrange Program

Capt. William E.
