Sees Life As Fight For Your Stability

Evanson, Ill. — A Northwestern university specialist in mental and nervous diseases defines life as a constant "struggle for equilibrium" from birth to death.

Dr. Meyer Solomon said in an address before the Chicago Neurological society that the "struggle" is the search for peace of mind, inner harmony, serenity and poise.

Poise begins at birth, he said, and just plain living subjects the average person to more than enough stress and strain.

Newborn Baby

The newborn baby is subjected to stress, he said, from a variety of sources, including noise, light, falling, hunger, wetness, uncleanliness, and pain.

In adult years, Solomon said, physical and pathological conditions and mental and social conflicts combine with occupational, financial and other pressures to create feelings of uneasiness, insecurity and anxiety.

In infancy and childhood, he said, the individual eases tension by crying, sucking his fingers, biting his nails and fidgeting.

The adult seeks to relieve excess strain in his desire for play, laughter, privacy, gambling, and addiction to alcohol and drugs, Solomon said.

Many U. S. Bridges Unsafe For Trucks

Washington (U.P.)—Only 1,607 of the 12,048 bridges on the nation's five major highways are designed or rated to sustain the weight of a 20-ton truck, according to a new congressional report on "highway needs of the national defense."

However, there isn't a state in the nation which has a truck weight limitation of 20 tons or less. Thirty-three states allow trucks weighing 30 tons or more and one state allows trucks weighing 68 tons.

Recently at Little Falls, N. J., a wooden bridge posted with a weight limit of eight tons collapsed after a trailer-truck weighing 44 tons passed over it. The state's legal limit is 30 tons.

An increasing number of bridge failures is reported by most states and in Ohio 70 bridges have failed completely in the past two years.
