

Benefits As Result Of War Service Exempt From State Income Taxes

Salem, Ore., Mar. 23.—(U.P.)—Men and women of the armed forces who receive benefits as result of war service will not have to pay state income taxes on such income in most instances, the Oregon department of veterans' affairs said today.

Oregon men currently on active duty with the armed forces will not be taxed for their incomes except in the high pay brackets. But a certain portion of national guard and armed forces reserve pay received in 1949 will be subject to taxation, the department said. April 15 is the deadline for filing.

Exemptions Listed

The state veterans' agency listed the following items as tax exempt:

1. Compensation and pensions paid by the veterans administration to veterans or their survivors.
2. GI insurance death payments, and GI insurance dividends.
3. Bonuses paid by other states.
4. All subsistence benefits for education and training under the GI bill and public law 16, unemployment benefits, and state educational aid payments.
5. Terminal leave and mustering-out pay, and government allotments to dependents of personnel on active duty.
6. All disability retirement pay received by wartime emergency officers from the veterans administration. However, disability retirement pay which is

paid by the armed forces to ex-army or navy regular officers is exempt only to \$1,500.

Military retirement pay for length of service is taxable.

First \$3,000 Exempt

Oregon law exempts the first \$3,000 of pay received for active duty in the armed forces. The attorney general's office has ruled that national guard and reserve component pay earned during participation in encampments or maneuvers or in armed forces schools rates the \$3,000 exemption, but not pay for army drill or other part-time duty, which is considered "inactive duty training."

The United States civil service commission today announced examinations for 10 positions in the field of communications. Positions, with their annual salaries, are: Communications coding, \$2,875 to \$4,600; communications facilities specialist,

\$3,825 to \$6,400; communications service supervisor, \$3,450 to \$6,400; communications specialist (radio and wire), \$3,100 to \$6,400; communications specialist (teletype), \$3,825 to \$4,600; telegrapher, \$3,100 to \$3,450; telegrapher (semi-automatic teletype equipment), telegraphic typewriter technician, and telegraphic typewriter supervisor, \$2,875 to \$5,400.
