RINGWORM GETS AROUND

Ringworm is a disease of the skin caused by several varieties of fungi. A fungus is a microscopic vegetable organism or body, of a very low order of life, an example of which is a mold—such as very commonly seen in discarded food.

Many fungi may be eaten in quantity without harm to the body—such as mold in cheese and other foods. In fact, many fungi are actually the source of essential food principles. Yeasts are fungi and are the source of a rich supply of vitamin B.

Generally speaking, most fungi are very slightly menacing to man. They may cause disease of the superficial layers of the skin, and also of the hair and nails. These are the disorders named "ringworm."

Some fungi are more menacing to man. The "ray fungus" which causes a disease in cattle known as "lumpy jaw," causes a similar disease in the human. Other serious diseases of man may be caused by certain types of fungi. The disease depends upon the specific kind of fungus concerned. It should be understood that common yeasts and molds do not cause serious disease in man, although they may give rise to persistent and troublesome minor diseases of the skin. Ringworm may attack the skin of the body in various locations. Ringworm is usually given a secondary name depending upon the location of the disease. Thus "athlete's foot" is ringworm of the toes and feet. "Barber's itch" is ringworm of the bearded region of the face. "Jockey-strap itch" is ringworm of the inside of the thighs and crotch.

Ringworm of the scalp results in breaking off of the hairs in patches which present a "stubby" appearance. I have not heard of any other lay term for this disorder. Ringworm appearing on non-hairy areas of the body is characterized by circular, reddened areas of small diameter, which gave rise to the name, under the supposition that a "worm" gained access to the skin and bored around in circles.

Ringworm is a contagious disease affecting both man and animals. While man may acquire ringworm from handling animals, different types of fungi exhibit a marked preference for one or the other to the extent that transference of the disease from animals to man is purely incidental.

Children are particularly susceptible to ringworm of the scalp and body but rarely develop "athlete's foot." Adults often

develop athlete's foot but seldom acquire ringworm of the scalp. The reason for this is not clearly understood.

Ringworm of the scalp has reached epidemic proportions. The disease is readily transmitted from child to child both directly and indirectly. Perhaps the most important means of indirect infection involves the back of chairs against which children rest their heads. The chairs in moving picture theaters, designed primarily for the comfort of adults, are particularly in point.

Ringworm of the feet may also be acquired indirectly, as by using contaminated shower stalls and the approaches thereto. Efforts to prevent spread of infection by the use of medicated foot baths have been found to be unsuccessful.

Treatment of ringworm will be the subject of a subsequent article.

ENLARGED HEART AND BLOCKED HEART

Is there such a thing as an enlarged heart? If so, what is the cause? What is a blocked heart—and the cause? (N. P.)

Answer—Enlargement of the heart often occurs. Disease of the heart valves is one cause. Circulatory obstruction is another cause. The heart is a large organ, the contraction of the lower chambers of the heart, producing circulatory confusion with the heart. It is caused by disease of the mechanism contained within the heart which governs the synchronization of nervous control. I fear this is a large order for you—but you've asked for it.

CALCIUM DEPOSIT IN THE SHOULDER
My husband is taking a vitamin D and calcium preparation which has caused a calcium deposit in the shoulder. The vitamin D and calcium preparation affect this?

Answer—Certain toxic effects of synthetic vitamin D are due to toxic by-products caused by faulty preparation and not due to vitamin D itself. The dose necessary to produce undesirable effects is 1,000 times greater than the dose used to combat vitamin D deficiency. As a matter of fact, when huge doses of vitamin D are given, calcium is withdrawn from all available deposits in the body and deposited in the circulating blood. There is no reason to fear that calcium deposits may be caused or aggravated by the rational use of vitamin D.

IMMEDIATE DENTURES
I have been installing immediate dentures for over 25 years. We are in agreement on this point (R. P. W. D.D.S.).
Answer—Some of your colleagues gave me a hard time when I recommended the practice. A great many persons have yet to learn that dentures (partial) may be prepared in advance of extraction of teeth and installed immediately, as permanent plates. The word permanent has given rise to much argument. Adjustments must be made from time to time on all plates—immediate or delayed. (Copyright 1950 by John F. Dille Co.)
