WHAT TO DO ABOUT RINGWORM

Although the fungi which cause ringworm are not highly menacing to life, they do cause stubborn diseases of the skin, many years of experience have shown that powerful germicides and antiseptics by themselves, do not cure the disease.

As a matter of fact, ringworm is often complicated by injury to the skin through the use of powerful remedies. Self-prescribed remedies advertised to the public as the "answer" to the ringworm problem often result in bringing the victim to the doctor with a skin disorder far worse and more persistent than the original complaint.

Recently, the application of strong, skin-destroying remedies has given way to the use of mild drugs containing an acid which the skin normally manufactures itself. It has been found that an optimum amount of this acid, kept in prolonged contact with the skin, has been curative without damaging or irritating the tissues.

The use of this drug is known to every physician who treats diseases of the skin. I do not mention the name of the drug because I do not wish to encourage self-prescribing. Further, the drug is so well known to the medical profession that it is unnecessary to write me about it.

This drug is applicable both to ringworm of the body and of the feet.

Perhaps more "athlete's foot" exists in fancy than in fact. Despite what appears to be utterly simple signs—pointed out by the purveyors of direct-to-the-public "remedies," by which the lay person can immediately diagnose his own case, not every case of itching, burning, toes with whitish moist skin in the webs, is actually athlete's foot. More than one geek has spent time and money treating himself for athlete's foot which did not exist.

Inasmuch as the fungus may be found in the shoes and clothing of the victim—providing a ready source of re-infection, these should be changed frequently. Ordinary laundering and dry cleaning is sufficient for clothes and underclothes.

Shoes may be disinfected by formaldehyde. A few drops of the solution may be placed upon cotton which is inserted into the shoes. They are then wrapped in paper—or placed in an airtight box and stored outdoors overnight. The neighborhood druggist should be willing to dispense an adequate amount of the solution necessary for the purpose.

From the standpoint of economy and intelligence the victim of ringworm—or the person who suspects he might have it—is wise in placing himself under a doctor's care.

I just read your answer regarding cataracts: "What has your mother to lose even if the operation fails to give the best result in her case?" Hope that correspondent never asks for any more of your advice. I know I won't. (Mrs. J. C.)
Answer—I'm sorry, but I don't understand why you dislike the answer. Reason for cataract operation is to save some useful sight. Without operation the sight cannot be saved. If the operation proves unsuccessful, at least the patient has been given the chance.
Receding Gums
Although I have always taken excellent care of my teeth and visited my dentist twice yearly, I find that now, at 43, my gums are receding alarmingly. (J. J.)
