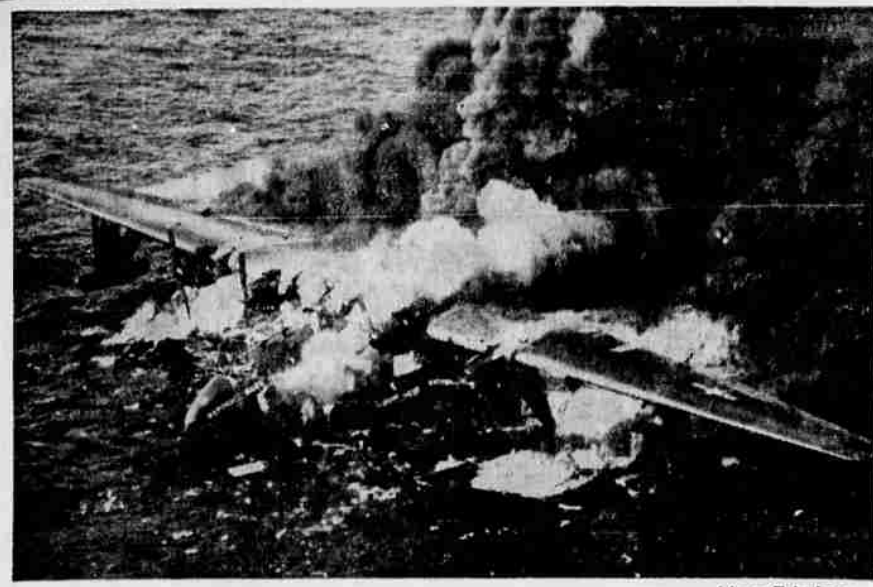

What Would Happen in Northwest Attack? Field Exercise Discloses Some Answers

Fort Lewis, Wash., Apr. 8.—(UPI)—What would happen if an enemy should land on the west coast, capture Portland, Ore., and then launch an attack against cities in western Washington?

Some of the answers were given today in an army exercise which has been going on since April 3 was a test of the area's defense against just such an eventuality.

A mythical intelligence report received here at noon on April 3, said, "Aggressor forces have made landing on the west coast. They have secured Portland, Ore., against initial light resistance. Air and ground reconnaissance of their activities indicate that Portland is being used as a base springboard for a ground and airborne attack on Olympia, Tacoma, Seattle and the entire northwest."

The second division immediately mobilized to put pre-arranged operation plans into effect. Three regiments of infantry—the 9th, 23rd and 38th—

field and anti-aircraft units, combat engineers and tank teams, assumed concealed positions on a line north of the Nisqually river west of highway 99. Another corps took the defense west of the sector. Along this line, the division dug in and presented a strong defensive position almost a mile in depth.

The division command post was located on a heavily-forested knoll at the north end of the "Marne" forest. Brig. Gen.

Loyal M. Haynes, director of the maneuvers, controlled the pulse of the field operation by an intricate maze of radio and wire communications system.

The "aggressor" forces were represented by elements of the 4th experimental combat team and 2nd Recon. Co. clad in foreign attire and a few succeeded in infiltrating deep into the defenders' territory before they were "captured."

On the second day, "enemy" airborne troops in force dropped in the vicinity of Olympia. After "capturing" U. S. army tanks and vehicles and utilizing highway 99, they were moving north and threatening to grab Tacoma.

The aggressor forces attached the 9th infantry, forcing it to execute a "retrograde movement," a term denoting withdrawal to an advantageous position.

But in the evening, the 9th infantry, reorganized and reinforced, made a vigorous counter-attack. The aggressor air-borne troops were "annihilated," and Tacoma, Seattle and the northwest were made secure.

Looks, Not Money Test of Beauty Students Report

Chapel Hill, N. C.—(UPI)—At least one student on the University of North Carolina campus is worried over the type of "beauty" that may represent his school nationally.

An organization on the campus is sponsoring a beauty contest. A girl is to be chosen on the basis of "personality, looks, and activeness in campus affairs."

Anybody can vote, at a penny per ballot.

Fretting over the possibilities, one student wrote a letter to the Daily Tar Heel. He had this to say:

"Everything possible should have been done to see that Carolina is represented by the prettiest, most personable, and most all-around co-ed."

"...But let's face it. As the contest now is being conducted, if the 'I've Got an Oil Well Club' were to sponsor the local Lena the Hyena, don't think for a minute that we wouldn't be represented by this monstrosity."

"...if the prettiest, most all-around girl does win and does become our representative... it will just be a happy coincidence."

The apprehensive correspondent said vote buying was frowned upon "even" in politics. A beauty contest, he wrote, is "usually far less corrupt."

Another letter commented on the "beautiful co-eds forging ahead—penny by penny—into the rat race for the title, 'Miss Beautiful Junior Miss.'"

Suggestions were offered to combat this apparent evil. Stamping of ID cards and a check-off roster headed the list.

The front page carried pictures of three of the leading candidates. All appeared well equipped to do beauty battle.

But with such enthusiastic observers, a change is in the cards for beauty contests at the University of North Carolina.

As the letter to the editor said, the winner should be the girl who has the "fullest degree of characteristics" and not the one who has the "fullest money pouch."
