Rogues Bill More Games

Santa Maria, Cal., Apr. 14—(U.P.)—Cal Poly defeated the Medford Rogues of the Far West league 9 to 8 in a pre-season baseball game here yesterday. The Rogues out-hit the collegians 13 to 5.

Santa Maria Cal., Apr. 14—(Special to Mail Tribune)—Manager Tommy Nelson of the Medford Rogues today repeated his praise of the Far West league team's infield with Shortstop Russ Stuart and Third Baseman Al Bolen looking particularly impressive so far.

"Dutch" Reuther, scout for the New York Giants with whom the Rogues have a working agreement, has termed Bolen as the best prospect in the combined Idaho Falls-Medford training camp.

The Rogues are scheduled to play Visalia of the California league Saturday and Sunday in a pair of "after dark" practice games at Visalia. Medford will journey to Santa Barbara Monday to meet the state college Gauchos.

The Gauchos go to Santa Maria to battle the Rogues next week Tuesday.

Manager Nelson singled in Medford's only run in the practice game with Cal Poly earlier this week, which Medford lost 8 to 1.

Frank Zazula Selected Coach at N. Dakota U.
Grand Forks, N. D., Apr. 14—(U.P.)—Frank Zazula, former University of Oregon backfield coach, yesterday was named head football coach for the University of North Dakota.

Zazula succeeds Dick Miller, also from Oregon, who resigned last week to take over football coaching duties at McKinley high, Canton, O. Zazula had been backfield coach for North Dakota one year as Miller's assistant.

Witnesses Ordered In Kansas Crime Probe

Kansas City, Mo., Apr. 14—(U.P.)—A special federal grand jury, ordered by President Truman to investigate Kansas City crime, has notified all witnesses to reappear Monday.

The names of two perennial grand jury witnesses were off the list, however. They were democratic boss Charles Binaggio and his hoodlum hatchet man, Charles Gargotta.

Their bodies were found April 6 in Binaggio's democratic club-room on Truman road. Each had been shot four times in the head.

Chicago Link Eyed In Binaggio Slaying
Chicago, Apr. 14—(U.P.)—Two Kansas City detectives today sought a "Chicago link" to the slaying of political boss Charles Binaggio.

Lt. Lester Haupt, who arrived here last night with Detective William Myers, hinted that he will contact local underworld big shots during the investigation.

Haupt said they plan to run an elaborate series of tests in an effort to match six of the bullets taken from the body of Binaggio and his bodyguard, Charles Gargotta, with those collected in recent Chicago gangland slayings.

Rocky Mountain Fever Reported in Portland
Portland, Ore., Apr. 14—(U.P.)—The state health board reported today that the year's first two cases of Rocky Mountain spotted fever had been reported.

Both were in Malheur county. As a result, State Health Director Harold M. Erickson reminded fishermen to get vaccinations before they took trips east of the Deschutes.

During the last two years, 15 cases of the fever have been reported in eastern Oregon with one death included.

Halsey, Waters Ring Mix Seen As Big Attraction

Two Negroes who are widely known in west coast simon-pure ranks will occupy the top spot. They are Bull Halsey, from the PAL club in Portland, and Clint Waters, California middleweight champion. They will enter the ring at between 155 and 160 pounds. Waters substitutes for Levi Robinson, who was injured in training. Waters has beaten Robinson three times.

Halsey made his debut here on March 22 and immediately captured the hearts of the fans with the easy manner in which he defeated Don Harper, Gold Hill prize, Halsey was runner-up in a recent AAU tournament in Portland and his tiff with Robinson is being billed as for the Oregon-northern California middleweight championship.

Waters is said by Promoter Owen Thomas and Larry Burdette to be the most outstanding middleweight in the bay area. He recently won the California middleweight title and is said to be a crowd pleasing free swinging climber.

Toronto, April 14—(U.P.)—Gallant Edgar La Prade of the New York Rangers was the toast of Toronto today as the blueshirts drew even with Detroit in the final rush for the National Hockey League's Stanley cup.

La Prade, who was counted out of the cup playoff three weeks ago when he ripped some knee ligaments in a late season contest, bagged two goals while playing on a knee brace last night to give New York a 3 to 1 victory over Detroit.

The triumph knotted the cup series at one game apiece.

Where To Fish

Portland Ore., Apr. 14—(U.P.)—The state game commission today forecast excellent fishing in coastal areas but poorer prospects in most inland regions when the early angling season opens tomorrow.

Coastal lakes and streams, with the exception of the upper Rogue and Umpqua systems, will be open to fishing. Willamette valley streams, except those in Linn and Lane counties and the North Santiam river system, will be open.

The commission said there were excellent prospects for good cutthroat fishing in the coastal system.

Present water conditions also appear to be good for fishing in all streams of the central coastal area.

Cook county streams were described as clear and not too high. Prospect for Curry county streams was "fair."

The Ducklings scored 72½ points to 57½ for the Rooks while OCE trailed with 33 points. Ralph Sutton, Bend, member of the Rooks, hurled the javelin 191 feet 5 inches for one of the best marks of the day.
