All cubs, scouts and explorer scouts of Jackson and Josephine counties will receive official Boy Scout calendars next year, H. D. Christensen, president of Crater Lake Area council, announced today. The calendars are from the original painting by the noted painter, Norman Rockwell. They portray a cub, boy scout, explorer, air and sea scout facing together a "bright future for our country in spite of the storm clouds that hang over the world today."

Through scouting, these young men will be able to help to build a greater country and a better understanding of the world in the future, Christensen said.

Every registered boy will receive one of the pictures to hang in his home as a daily reminder of his part of the responsibility of living in our country and the world.

"We are grateful to the McLain Drug company of Medford and Grants Pass for making these calendars available to all our young men and in helping us do a better job of scouting in the Crater Lake Area council", Christensen stated. "This will be the first year that so large a number of these calendars will be made available to the scouts in these two counties. McLain's will also make these calendars available to other homes outside of those in the boy scout program. All public and private schools, city and county officers will receive special Boy Scout calendars," he said.

The calendar has had the largest distribution of any in the United States over a period of several years. The calendar of the Dionne quintuplets has been the closest of any other calendar in numbers placed in homes.

Movie Advertising Target in Clean-Up

Hollywood, Apr. 20.—A congressional investigator opened an inquiry into Hollywood morals by conferring with a high industry executive on ways to clean up movie advertising.

Judge Stephen S. Jackson, making an on-the-spot check for Sen. Edwin C. Johnson (D., Colo.) conferred yesterday with Dore Schary, production head of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studios and chairman of the motion picture industry public relations committee.

Jackson and Schary described the meeting as "informal and amicable" but did not reveal what was discussed. Schary said he would arrange a meeting between Jackson and other motion picture industry council members.

The investigator said he would confine his probe to efforts to prevent "unfavorable exploitation" of scandals in movie advertising.

The Colorado senator has introduced legislation which provides for licensing of the motion picture industry.
