Connie Mack Gains Honor

Philadelphia, Apr. 21—(U.P.)—Connie Mack, acclaimed at 87 as the "greatest figure in American sports," received the accolades of the nation and the world today in the celebration of his golden anniversary as manager of the Philadelphia Athletics.

The grand old man of baseball, who "changed my mind about retiring" during the past few weeks, will receive a scroll bearing the signatures of more than 1,000,000 persons in ceremonies before the Athletics meet the Boston Red Sox in the first home game of Mack's 50th managerial season.

Signatures on the scroll, sponsored by the Sunday Bulletin, included those of President Truman, Vice President Alvin Barkley, all members of the president's cabinet, governors of all the states, every major figure in baseball and fans from 15 countries.

New Records Coast Track

San Francisco, Apr. 21—(U.P.)—A flock of new records are expected to be set this week-end as six Pacific Coast conference schools collide in dual track meets.

Powerful USC meets underdog California at Berkeley, Idaho battles Oregon State at Corvallis and Washington State and Oregon fight it out in a meet which will put on display a number of northern division champions.

Best bet for a new record in the CAL-USC festivities may be big Sim Iness, the Trojan discus thrower. Iness tossed the platter 177 feet, four inches this spring—a record surpassed by only five men in history.

Oregon's Webfoots, under Coach Bill Bowerman, have a powerful, well-balanced squad. They have three fine pole vaulters in George Rasmussen (14 feet), Don Pickens (13 feet) and Lloyd Hickock (12 feet, 6 inches) and an outstanding sprinter in Dave Henthorne. He covered the century in 9.7 against Idaho.

Rainbow Trout Stripped

Portland, Ore., Apr. 21—(U.P.)—State game commission crews today were busy stripping eggs from spawning rainbow trout at four hatcheries.

A yield of 1,530,000 rainbow eggs was taken from the McKenzie river hatchery with 250,000 eggs taken from trout at the Spencer creek hatchery. Further egg supplies will be gathered at East and Paulina lakes and Diamond lake stations.
