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Italian Girl 'Adopted' By Medford Woman

A Medford woman, who believes that her contribution is only a small part of the aid that needs to be given, has "adopted" a 10-year-old Italian girl, Anna Maria Cappella.

The little girl's benefactor has asked to remain unidentified. Anna is not coming to this country nor will she be adopted in the usual sense of the word. Under the Foster Parents' Plan for War Children, the Medford woman has agreed to contribute \$15 per month for at least a year toward Anna's support.

In return the Medford woman has received a photograph of the girl and there will be correspondence between the two through the plan office.

One of 9 Children
 Anna's plight is similar to that of many children in Europe. She is one of nine children of a family and lives in the Nomentana colony. During the occupation her father was taken by the Germans for slave labor and was never heard of again.

Her mother has tried to care for the children as best she can and works, when she can, as a farmhand for 50 cents a day. The work is in summer and the family live in destitution in winter. The house is only a poor hut of earth without electric lights or water. There are not enough beds, and all members of the family have insufficient food and clothing.

Get Necessities
 One of the boys is mutilated. Anna's mother appealed to the Plan for aid, and now Anna and her sister live in the Nomentana colony. For the first time they are receiving the necessities of life.

Anna, Plan officers said, is motherly and worried about the welfare of her sister. She would like to learn fancy knitting.

To aid children such as Anna, the Foster Parents Plan began operation 13 years ago. In those years it has helped 60,000 children. It is now operating in England, France, Belgium, Holland, Czechoslovakia, Italy, Greece and China.

The Medford woman said she signed up after reading a Plan advertisement in Time magazine.

Milkman Said Short On Cream Deliveries

McCarthy admitted that he had padded his bills for six months and made \$350 on the deal. Holland, however, charged the milkman had been doing it for seven years and had made himself \$3,500. He swore out a warrant charging McCarthy with taking money under false pretenses.

Washington Legion Service Officer Here
 Camp White, Apr. 27—Henry W. Cooke, assistant service officer for the American Legion's department of Washington, arrived at Camp White Monday and will remain through Friday attending to Washington members' affairs. Cooke's trip to White is the first from his office and was made because 20 per cent of the members are from that state.

The job of a service officer is to assist veterans in filing claims represent them before a rating board and advise and assist in obtaining evidence for claims. They also advise on insurance problems, and assist widows and families in filing and processing claims for pensions and insurance.

Serve a bit of Springtime...

LEMON VELVET PIE by *Martha Meade*
 Famous Western Food Authority

Sift flour before measuring. Use level measurements for all ingredients.

Mix together thoroughly —
 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
 6 tablespoons cornstarch
 1/2 teaspoon salt

Add mixture slowly, stirring constantly, to —
 1 1/2 cups boiling water

Cook over direct heat, stirring occasionally, until thickened and smooth. Then place over boiling water and cook 15 minutes longer. Then add —
 2 egg yolks, well beaten
 2 tablespoons butter or margarine

Cook 2 minutes more, remove from heat and add —
 1/2 cup strained lemon juice
 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Take out 1 cupful filling and set aside to cool. To remaining hot filling add —
 1 tablespoon granulated gelatine, softened in
 1/4 cup cold water

Stir until gelatine dissolves, then blend in —
 1 cup table cream

Cool and when mixture begins to jell, fold in —
 2 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Pour mixture into —
 a baked and cooled 9-inch pie shell

Let stand in a cool place until partially set, about 10 minutes. Then spread the 1 cup cooled lemon filling over top of pie. Keep in a cool place or refrigerator until thoroughly set. 6 servings.
