### Public Land Requests Reach Record Volume

March applications for the use of the public domain reached 4,000—a record for recent years, according to a bureau of land management report. That is more than 50 per cent higher than the monthly average over the last year, the report said.

Increased activity during March was reported generally throughout the bureau's seven regions, with particular interest shown in oil and gas leases and small tract applications. Small tracts are parcels of land, five acres or less, which have been classified for use of home, business or recreational sites.

Fifty-six land withdrawal applications were made to the bureau during the month from other federal and state agencies for land to be withdrawn from the public domain for use as irrigation or power sites.
