



"SCENICRUISER" TO BE EXHIBITED HERE—The Greyhound "Scenicruiser," new six-wheeled streamlined bus, will be exhibited at the Greyhound bus depot, fifth and Bartlett streets, on Wednesday, May 3, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. M. G. Becker, local agent of the firm, announced today. Greyhound terms this vehicle "a new travel miracle." The bus seats 43 passengers and gives each "front seat visibility," Becker said. It has two windshields and skylights in addition to spacious windows. He reported that the bus is more than 90 per cent glass above seat level and that sun glare is filtered out by a new tinting method. The vehicle has a lavatory, drinking fountain, two-way radio, public address system and facilities for playing recorded music. Commander Scott of the "Romance of the Highways" radio program will be master of ceremonies for the showing. At Ashland the bus will stop between 10:30 and 10:45 a.m. Wednesday.

A state championship will be decided in Medford on Sunday, May 7.

Lt. Donald Stewart, commander of the Medford civil air patrol flight, announced today that the state drill competition for CAP cadets had been definitely set for 1 p.m. Sunday at the Medford senior high football field.

Two Squadrons

Only two drill squadrons, one from the Medford flight and one from Portland, will participate. The winning contingent will win a free air jaunt to Ogden, Utah, for the regional drill contest.

The activity here will be open to the public and Stewart has urged a big turnout of Medfordites to support the local boys.

Medford's cadets have been drilling hard for months and the snappy precision they have achieved was in evidence last night when the youths held a regular session at the armory. Drill is continuing every evening this week at the junior high school tennis court. The marching and procedures are regulation military and CAP officials said they believe the Sunday performance will be colorful and worthy of public attendance.

To Arrive Sunday
The Portland squadron, Oregon wing officers and three judges are expected to arrive here by air late Sunday morning. The local flight will provide two judges and Stewart said that Col. E. J. Briggs will be one.

The Medford unit also will be inspected Sunday. An air inspection officer was to have been here last night but was held in Portland by weather, it was reported.

Police Officers of Oregon in Session

Salem, Ore., May 2—(U.P.)—City police officers from all parts of Oregon were in Salem today for opening sessions of the Oregon Association of City Police Officers convention.

Speakers here for the two-day convention include Chief of Police John D. Holstrom of Berkeley, Calif., and Chief of Police L. C. Crowthers of Salt Lake City and his assistant, R. L. Hunsaker. On today's program was a forum on "police training" under leadership of Capt. Clare D. Newman of Oregon City.

"Police and the Press" was the topic of a talk for Charles A. Sprague, Salem publisher and former governor.

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Attending Nurse

Miss Rose was the attending nurse when Dr. Sander injected 40 cubic centimeters of air into the veins of Mrs. Abbie C. Borroto, 59, as she lay on her death bed last December 4.

That action led to Dr. Sander's arrest, his superior court trial and his expulsion from four hospitals in the Manchester area. His license also was suspended by the New Hampshire board of registration in medicine with the possibility it will be renewed June 19.

The report of the letter came as four other principals in the famous case disclosed they had received "crank" letters and telephone calls criticizing their parts in the trial that ended in acquittal for the 41-year-old Candia physician March 9.

Of those, only Dr. Benjamin P. Burpee of Manchester, a member of the registration board, was threatened. An anonymous telephone caller said he saw "a boy putting something under his piazza" and that he thought it was a bomb.

Dr. Burpee dismissed the threat as the action of a crackpot. Others in the case took the same view as police disclosed they were taking no extraordinary precautions.

Liquor Commission Cancels Licenses

Portland, Ore., May 2—(U.P.)—The Oregon Liquor Control commission reported today it has cancelled one liquor dispensing license and suspended 24 others for violations of the liquor act.

The Club Sequin at Grants Pass had its license canceled for sale of alcoholic beverage to a minor.

Suspensions included Plaza Tavern, Klamath Falls, selling to intoxicated persons and selling after hours, 15 days; Owl Billiards, Cave Junction, selling to a minor, 10 days; Isacson and Fisher grocery, Eugene, selling to a minor, five days; Nose Bag cafe, Madras, selling to an Indian, 15 days; Dwyers Lodge, Salem, selling to an intoxicated person and selling to a minor, 15 days.

License suspensions for individuals included Pauling Kniesadt, The Dalles, Liberty club, selling to a minor, 10 days; Hubert Ellison, Eugene, Pastime, intoxicated while on duty, 15 days; Elbert Hale, Medford, Casino club, 10 days.
