

Aly Khan Denies Report of Rift With Rita Hayworth

Cannes, France, May 3—(U.P.) Prince Aly Khan today dismissed a Rome newspaper report that he and Rita Hayworth will seek a divorce as just so much more scandal-mongering.

"Nothing can spoil our wonderful relationship," the Ismail Moslem prince said in denying the divorce report which appeared in the newspaper *Il Messaggero*.

Victims of Tongues

"We have always been victims of vicious tongues, people who tried to find every pretext to blacken this wonderful normal and healthy relationship between me and Rita.

"We have been subjected to this kind of persecution since Rita left the United States to come to Europe to marry a foreigner.

"The scandal-loving women's organizations in the United States and the numerous worshippers of Rita who are disappointed in not seeing her any more are the ones who are really responsible."

On Buying Trip

Aly is recovering at his chalet here from a broken leg suffered in a Swiss skiing accident last winter. He said Miss Hayworth left Cannes for Paris yesterday.

"But merely to buy some new dresses," Aly said. "Nothing more."

"I know there's a lot of gossip when I go off to watch my horses run, or when Rita goes shopping to Paris. But nobody can pretend that means a definite separation. It doesn't mean a thing."

The Rome newspaper said Aly and Miss Hayworth would arrive here tomorrow to begin divorce proceedings. Actually, Aly said, they have been in Cannes for some time.

Father Will Give Daughter Away in Long Distance Rite

Winchester, Mass., May 3—(U.P.)—Sitting in a living room chair, Peter Benson will give his pretty daughter Charlotte in marriage tonight as her pastor participates in the ceremony 1,786 miles away.

The wedding will take place at the Grace Lutheran church in Denver, Colo., where Charlotte will marry GI student Kenneth Geisert while an elaborate telephone-loudspeaker setup relays the rite to her parent and some 35 friends in Winchester.

At the appointed moment, Benson will speak the words into the telephone that will give the bride away. Rev. Ralph O. Hiem of the Church of the Redeemer in Woburn will give the closing prayer and benediction the same way.

Parents Can't Attend

The arrangement was made by the bride-to-be when her parents told her they would be unable to attend the ceremony involving their only daughter.

The young couple met while he was attending the University of Colorado and she was on a trip there. She subsequently obtained a job teaching at Denver.

As the couple leaves on a western honeymoon, the Bensons will hold a reception—minus the bride and bridegroom—at their home for relatives and friends.

No Trace Found of Railroad Man's Body

Eugene, Ore., May 3—(U.P.)—Authorities said today they had found no trace of the body of George Thompson, 24, Southern Pacific engineer who fell into the Willamette river while walking a cross a log foot bridge.

Thompson tried to swim to safety but struck his head on a rock and disappeared.

School Teacher Freed on Charges Of Fondling Girls

Eufaula, Okla., May 3—(U.P.)—Country Schoolmaster W. E. Dickey felt "like a free man again" today following his acquittal on charges of fondling his young girl students.

A jury composed chiefly of farmers returned a "not guilty" verdict yesterday after deliberating only 43 minutes to end the 33-year-old teacher's sensational two-day trial.

Felony Charge Filled

McIntosh County Attorney Jimmie Whiteley filed felony charges against Dickey, who has been teaching 26 years, mainly on the complaint of Norma Lee Camp, an 11-year-old pupil.

The crowd jamming the courtroom sneezed yesterday when Norma Lee, wearing pigtails, testified that Dickey placed his hand under her skirt as she stood by the desk.

The slim, dark-haired girl said under cross-examination she hadn't mentioned the incident to her mother until after Whiteley had taken action against the schoolmaster.

Cleared by Board

Whiteley originally filed only a misdemeanor charge when a student complained that Dickey had snapped the elastic on her panties. The Eufaula school board cleared Dickey at a hearing, but Whiteley later filed the felony charge.

Fireman Injured; Historic Home Burns

Portland, Ore., May 3—(U.P.)—One fireman was injured and an historic 67-year-old home burned to the ground yesterday as firefighters ran out of water in an effort to save the Omar C. Spencer residence on Sauvies island.

Norman Calvin, 25, of Portland, was recovering in the Good Samaritan hospital today after a live, 220-volt wire fell from the burning two-story dwelling into Calvin's open hand.

An island resident, Renny Rau, saved Calvin's life by pushing him away from the wire with a chair he had carried out of the house.

The fire broke out in the upper story, but firemen could not pump enough water into the flames to put them out. However, neighbors saved nearly all furnishings and Spencer's valuable library of Oregon history.

Loss of the house was covered by insurance.

West German Cabinet In Emergency Meeting

Frankfurt, Germany, May 3—(U.P.)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer called the west German cabinet into emergency meeting at dawn today to discuss the Moscow announcement that Russia has repatriated all German prisoners of war.

German officials said the announcement was "unbelievable." They said the announcement meant 400,000 German prisoners will spend the rest of their lives in Russia. Western allied officials estimated between 225,000 and 250,000 still are held in Russia.

Moscow's statement must not and cannot be the final word on the fate of countless Germans," West Berlin Mayor Ernst Reuter said. "This will hit thousands of German homes like a thunderbolt."

The Soviet announcement was distributed last night by the Tass agency and broadcast over radio Moscow.

It said the recent return of 17,000 Germans marked the completion of repatriation except for 13,548 men who still are held for various reasons. Of these, 9,717 have been condemned for serious war crimes, 3,815 are under investigation and 14 are ill, Moscow said.

Mediator Discusses End of UP Strike

New York, May 3—(U.P.)—J. R. Mandelbaum, federal conciliation commissioner, met separately yesterday with representatives of the United Press and the Commercial Telegraphers' union (AFL) in an attempt to settle a strike of the U.P. printer operators.

"Exploring all possibilities in order to solve the strike situation, I am continuing to meet with both parties," the commissioner said.

The U.P. management said that for the fourth day the news report flowed normally yesterday to its clients in the United States and abroad. The strike was called Sunday midnight. Union leaders demanded an average weekly wage increase of \$6.50. Just before the strike management offered \$2.21. Both those offers were subsequently withdrawn.
