Rogue River To Hold Mother-Daughter Event

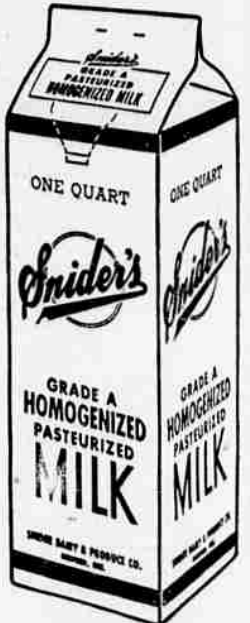

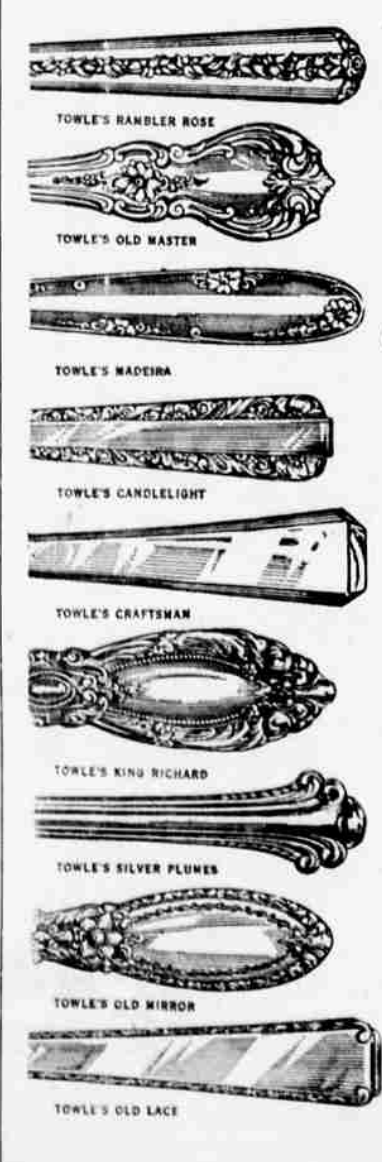
