**EXERCISE FOR WEAK HEART**  
In a recent article I said: It is my belief that at least premature C-V-D come about largely in consequence of prolonged moderate deficiencies—through many years—of three vitamins—thiamine, riboflavin and D, and three minerals, calcium, phosphorus and iodine.

**GRADUATED EXERCISE** there after improves the tone of heart and chesty muscle. Either of these remedies, as well as correction of nutritional deficiencies, should be part of the treatment of every cardiovascular (heart and artery) trouble, whether the patient receives digitalis or other medicines or not.

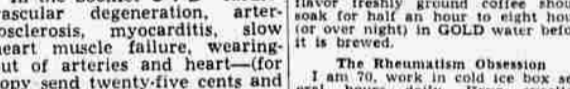
**The Rheumatism Obsession**

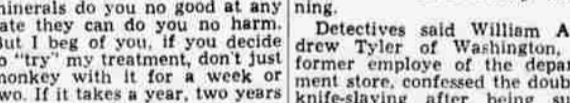

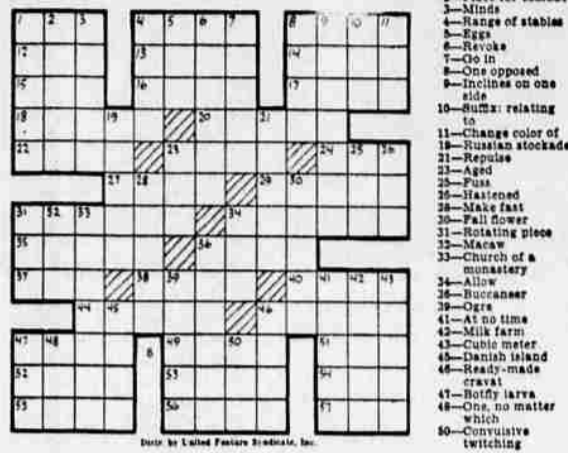

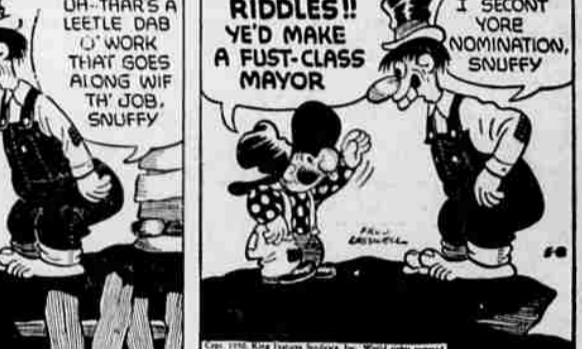
