Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in School District No. 49 of Jackson County, State of Oregon, from 2:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M., Pacific Standard Time, at the Senior High School, in said school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1950-51, over the amount limited by section 11, article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:
To meet current operation costs and employment of additional teachers required.
The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said fiscal year is \$213,617.60.
