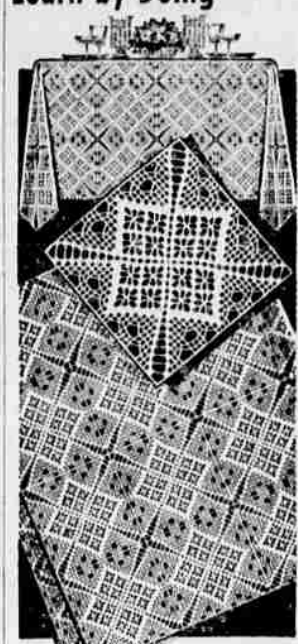

Myrna Quackenbush was honored at a farewell party given May 5 at the home of Beverly Nelson on the North Pacific highway.

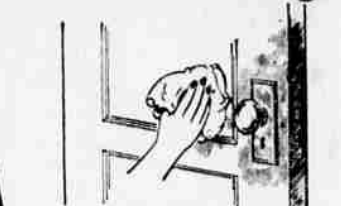

2 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Pour mixture into —
a baked and cooled 9-inch pie shell

Let stand in a cool place until partially set, about 10 minutes. Then spread the 1 cup cooled lemon filling over top of pie. Keep in a cool place or refrigerator until thoroughly set. 6 servings.
